FmHA Has Money For Recreation Now

Farmers seeking ways to supplement their farm incomes in these days of the "price-cost squeeze" are beginning to take advantage of recreation facilities loans available through Farmers Home Administration. "The State of North Carolina with its

abundance of natural beauty lends itself to income – producing outdoor recreation enterprises," FmHA State Director James T. Johnson pointed out. Only 15 farmers have taken

advantage of this opportunity since the inception of the programs several years ago. Most of these farms are in the mountains of western North Carolina except for three farmers in Hyde County who have developed marinas and camping facilities. The loans may be used to develop

land and water resources; repair and construct buildings; buy land, equipment, livestock and other equipment, livestock and other recreation items and pay necessary operating expenses.

Recreation enterprises that may be financed include:

- Camp grounds and equipment
- Horseback riding stables
- Swimming facilities
 Tennis courts
- Shooting preserves
 Vacation cottages
- Lodges and rooms for visitors
- Lakes and ponds
- for boating and fishing Nature trails
- Golf courses
- Hunting facilities
- Target ranges
 Trailer parks
- Winter sports areas

Andy Cope, in Macon County, is an excellent example of what a farmer can do with this FmHA financing, His farm of several hundred acres, in one of the most beautiful sections of North Carolina, had never been developed to its full income-producing resources. Taking advantage of the "lay of the land," its proximity to National Forest Land, the abundance of clear mountain streams, and Farmers Home Administration financing and technical help. Cope has developed one of the busiest recreation enterprises in the busiest recreation enterprises in the State. From small beginnings this development has become very profitable and provides cabins, fishing lakes, nature trails, and camping facilities for the traveling public. To qualify for recreation-type loans, Johnson added, the applicant must be engaged in farming at the time he applies for the loans and manage and operate the recreation enterprise after

operate the recreation enterprise after the loan is made.

Intermediate-term loans are made to finance recreation equipment and operating expenses. Such loans are secured by liens on chattel property, secured by liens on chatter property, including livestock, equipment and fixtures. Larger, long-term loans are also available and are generally secured by a mortgage on the farm. Unlike other Farmers Home Administration loans made to farmers, the recreation loans Farmers Home Administration loans made to farmers, the recreation loans are not limited to a family-type operation. Also, the farmer can retain nonessential real estate. Farmers all over the State are encouraged to visit their local office of FmHA to get the facts on these loans programs that may benefit them.

special purpose.

Mobile Home Buyers Covered For Repairs, Edmisten Says

Attorney General Rufus Edmisten issued a reminder to owners of 52 different mobile home models that they are entitled to repairs if specified problems or defects are covered in their warranties.

Edmisten said Thursday, May 15 is the deadline for submitting warranty related complaints to the Mobile Home Task Force, Room 226, Federal Trade Commission, Washington, D.C., and to the particular manufacturers.

Owners of certain models are eligible for the repairs. These are units constructed only between July 1, 1972

and June 30, 1974 by Commodore Corp., 8712 West Dodge Road, Omaha, Neb.; Fleetwood Enterprises, Inc., P.O. Box 7638, Riverside, Cal.; Redman Industries, Inc., 2550 Walnut Hill Lane, Dallas, Tex.; and Skyline Corp., 2520 By-Pass Road, Elkhart, Indiana.

Some 52 models manufactured by the four companies are listed by Edmisten.

Copies of complaints sent to the FTC and manufacturers should be sent to the Consumer Protection Division, Attorney General's Office, P.O. Box 629, Raleigh 27602.
