woman to Cape Fear Hospital and get the examination done as quickly as possible.

"This same doctor has done this before," Barrington complained. When contacted Monday, Allen refused to discuss any details of the incident, and declined to acknowledge he was called Thursday.

"You're trying to get information about a patient, and I'm not giving any information out," he said. Allen said he must follow standard hospital procedure in the handling of reported rape cases.

"Rape is a crime, not a medical condition, and it must be charged. I've tried to explain this to Mr. Barrington," Allen said.

Hospital administrator J. Crenshaw Thompson said the standard policy of Moore Memorial in suspected rape cases is for the emergency room doctor to refer the case to a member of the Obstetrics and Gynecology staff for evaluation. The hospital has four such physicians who are on an on-call basis, Thompson said.

Thompson said the physicians will want "an assurance a warrant (for rape) will be obtained," before undertaking procedures.

"Apparently he decided not to examine her, and it is his decision to examine her or not to examine her," Thompson said.

Magistrate George S. Hedgpeth said he would be unable to sign a rape warrant without the victim having been examined by a doctor.

"Normally, you'd get a doctor's examination first, I don't believe I'd write one without it," Hedgpeth said. "You'd really be putting yourself out on a limb, even though the lady would be swearing to it."

"There's no rush on the warrant, but time is important to get the woman to a doctor as soon as possible. The sooner the examination, the surer the diagnosis."

Hedgpeth said an insistence on a warrant drawn immediately after a reported rape could not be met in many cases.

"First of all, you have to have the name. Without that, I can't write any warrant."

He was my husband and our father. We loved him so, we'll always wish he didn't have to go. Late one evening an angel of love, Descended and took him to heaven above.

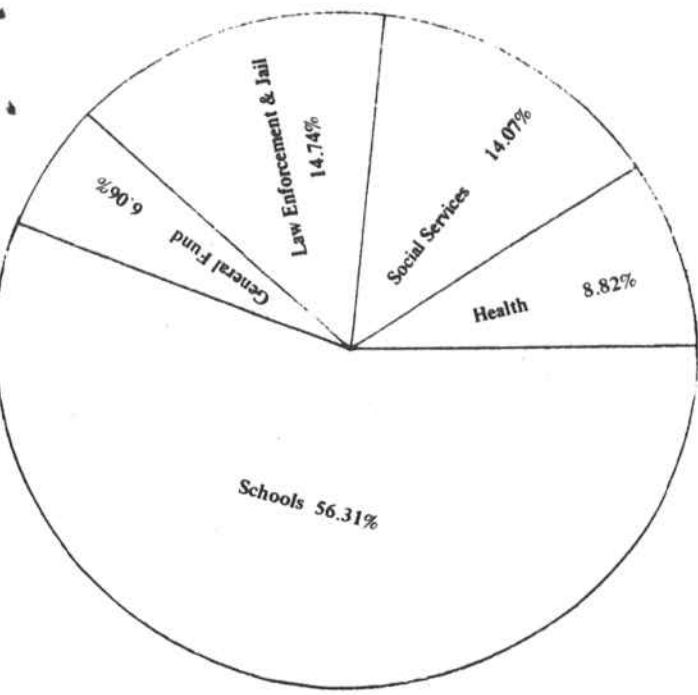
Now he is an angel of God you see. He lived with the good for now and eternity.

\$4,000 cut from capital outlay.

The board agreed to reduce the Register of Deeds capital outlay by \$1,000, but \$500 had to be put back in because of a broken air conditioner, Lester said.

Civil defense capital outlay funds which had been set at \$600 were cut to \$200.

The school system appropriations were reduced \$40,000 from what was requested, Lester said.

Social Services budget, in which the county's share has risen sharply, was trimmed by only \$1,350 from capital outlay funds for desks and office equipment.

The only pay increases for county employees approved by the board were a raise in the tax collector's salary to \$9,675, and adjustments for an assistant accounting clerk and assistant tax collector set at \$5,800.

The board also approved a \$1,000

pay increase in the sheriff's salary, but the raise was rejected by Sheriff D.M. Barrington Friday.

"I could use the money, but as long as my people aren't getting any raises, I won't take it," Barrington told Commissioner John Balfour.

"I won't be put in that position", Barrington said. "Take the money and split it up 12 ways".

The board also took up routine matters at the June 4 meeting, including certification of fire department rosters to meet state requirements.

The board voted to accept the bid of Williams Office Equipment Co. of Fayetteville for \$1,227.45 for carpeting of courthouse offices.

The board also agreed to advertise for the newly created position of building inspector at a \$8,500-9,500 yearly salary range.

Accent On Agriculture

The month of June has for many years been a time when dairy farmers and processors stepped up their efforts to promote more consumer use of milk and dairy products.

June has traditionally been a month when total fluid milk sales have dropped. This is mainly because schools have closed and many children do not have milk made available at home, and this is also the time many people consume other beverages as warm weather drinks. Many of the other drinks have little or no food value but cost as much or more than wholesome cold milk.

Some of the news media have consistently been critical of what they call the "high price" of milk in North Carolina. However, a survey of retail store milk prices during the past month reveals a price range from a ridiculous low of \$.88 per gallon up to \$1.95 per gallon. Many areas of the state have store prices in the

range of \$1.35 to \$1.49 per gallon. These prices are as low or lower than prevailing prices on the entire East Coast. The latest retail food prices released by the U.S. Department of Labor lists the average price in the United States for a half gallon of milk at 78.9 cents. This would be \$1.578 on a gallon basis.

In going just a step further, when the retail price of milk is \$1.40 per gallon the cost to consumers is only 1.1 cents per ounce; when the gallon price is \$1.65 the per-ounce cost is 1.3 cents; and even at a retail price of \$1.90 per gallon the consumer cost is only 1.5 cents per ounce.

Conscientious homemakers and all consumers should make cost comparisons between nutritious milk and carbonated sweetened beverages, as well as valid comparisons concerning health benefits.

The number of Grade A dairy farmers in North Carolina now number approximately 1,635. For the first three months of 1975 only four dairy herds were dispersed. This is an encouraging indication of some degree of stability for dairy farmers. Increased consumption of wholesome and nutritious milk can be the consumers way of giving a well-deserved pat on the back to the few remaining dairymen.
