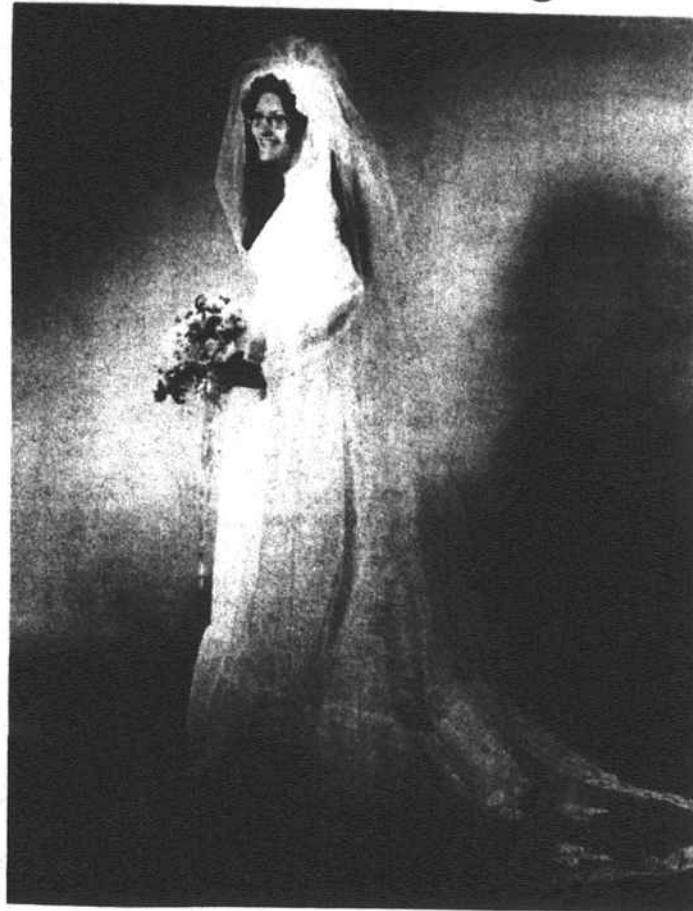
## Bridal Shower For Miss Hart
