

was designed to help teachers to instruct saleable skills related to food service





## **New Address - Notify DMV**

Motor Vehicles Commissioner Edward L. Powell reminded motorists that effective 1 July, legislation has enacted which affects North Carolina drivers applying for a change of address.

The new legislation requires persons holding North Carolina driver's license to notify the Division of Motor Vehicles of any address change within 60 days after such a change is made. Commissioner Powell advised that for drivers with an address change, it will be necessary to appear in person at any driver license office to obtain a bea duplicate license showing the change of address
