Net General Fund collections for June amounted to \$74.4 million, a decrease of \$8.1 million over last

year, state revenue officials reported. Net collections for fiscal 1974-75 were \$1.4522 billion, compared with \$1.3593 billion for 1973-74, an increase of 6.84%.

June net highway fund collections amounted to \$29.8 million, a decrease of 2.83% over last June. Gasoline tax receipts totaled \$23.5 million, a decrease of 1.30% over last year's period.


