pending further study.  
Under the new law, a county may be penalized 5% of their funds for welfare programs for failing to designate an agency, Lester said.  
The program, designed to lower expenditures for Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) by more vigorous investigation of paternity determination and fixing support, could be established within the DSS, or other existing agency, such as the county manager's office, attorney, or sheriff's department, the board was told.  
Attorney Bobby McNeill told the board he doubted his office "would have the time," and Lester showed little interest in implementing the program within his office.  
The board agreed to defer any

action on the matter until the details of the proposal could be sent to the sheriff, clerk of court, and other officials concerned.  
The board rejected the proposed "housing agent" to work within the extension office, a plan put forth earlier this month which would be implemented through A & T University at Greensboro under a grant.  
"I can't see any need for this individual," McBryde said, and Balfour and Barnhart expressed agreement. The motion to decline the offer was carried unanimously.  
A request for A. T. McLean, Jr., for a waiver of penalty on late tax listing was denied. The penalty amounted to about \$60, Lester reported.  
The board was briefed by Lester on possible reimbursement of indirect costs connected with the social services programs, but put off any formal action on the HEW application needed until they learned more about how much money is involved, said to be a very small amount.

**Antifreeze Warning**

The North Carolina Department of Agriculture has refused to register an antifreeze product labeled "Pretext Concentrated Anti-Freeze."  
According to Agriculture Commissioner Jim Graham, tests conducted in NCDA laboratories have revealed that the product does not meet standards established for antifreeze sold in North Carolina.  
"The N.C. Department of Agriculture has been advised that representatives of a Florida-based company have appeared in Charlotte and Wilmington in an attempt to sell distributorships for the Pretext product," Graham said. "We have alerted newspapers and police departments in those areas to be on the look out for the product."  
Dr. W.Y. Cobb, State Chemist, explained that Pretext antifreeze consists of a blend of inorganic salts which are worthless as antifreezes. "Use of the product would likely result in the corroding out of an engine cooling system within a period of several months, particularly at high operating temperatures."

**Traffic Laws Protect Blind**

Colonel E.W. Jones, North Carolina's Highway Patrol Commander, said that far too many motorists apparently do not recognize that a person using a white cane or harnessed guide dog is blind and afforded special protection by the motor vehicle laws of the state.  
"The guide dog," Colonel Jones said, "moves on the change of the light and when motorists fail to comply with the letter of the law a very dangerous situation exists." He added that the Highway Patrol has noted with grave concern the increasing number of motorists who stop before turning right on red, yet they enter the roadway in front of oncoming traffic. This is in violation as it interferes with the normal flow of traffic and could cause a serious accident, he said.

friends. I think the people of Raeford are behind me, though. They wanted to see it come out", he said.

Barefoot said he has not received any direct threats to himself or his family, but has been warned by friends to be careful. He said he very seldom goes to Raeford except in the daytime.  
"Several of my good friends have told me I better be careful, I might have an accident. You see, this thing (the investigation) is bigger than most people think", he added.  
"I've had a heck of a nerve problem, I'm under Dr. Jordan's care right now. In a way, I do feel fearful, but I'm trying not to worry my family. My brother was right shook up about it, he told me I should carry a gun", Barefoot said.  
"A lot of people told me I couldn't buck city hall. I had to do what I did."  
Barefoot said the continuing investigation will produce more indictments against Gaddy.  
"With the stuff I showed them, (the SBI) there should be several more charges", he asserted.

**Sunday School**

A number of years ago, a woman in my congregation found a little book entitled, FISH. The book was about a program of neighborly help that churches and groups of churches can sponsor in their own community. Services such as emergency babysitting, transportation, meals for the elderly, putting people in touch with community resources, etc., are provided by volunteers working through an advertised "Fish" telephone number and an answering service.  
The name, "Fish," is a reference to the ancient symbol by which Christians identified themselves to each other in the days of the Roman Empire. The fish symbol stood for Jesus Christ and thus it serves as an appropriate identification for the "Fish" Program.  
The woman from my congregation was excited by this program and shared the book with another parishioner who eventually gave the book to me. I, in turn, shared the book with a small Bible study and prayer group that met twice a month in members' homes. The group often talked about Christian witness: here was an opportunity to actually put some of those convictions into practice.  
One of the women in that group accepted responsibility to serve as the organizer and soon a modest beginning was made. Today, several years later, Fish is no longer a project of just that small group of people, nor even of our own church. It has become a county-wide co-operative effort in which many different churches participate both with volunteers and financial support.  
This is a simple illustration of what one person's efforts, "a pinch of salt," can accomplish for the Gospel. There was nothing dramatic about her efforts, but that one woman with her simple words of encouragement started in motion a most fruitful project that is reaching many lives for Christ.  
Our people who have participated in this project have found that this opportunity for witness has produced "salt," not only for those who are the beneficiaries of "Fish," but also the volunteers. It has provided some extra "flavor" for their Christian lives, just as table salt can do that for dull, tasteless foods.  
Too often we wonder what just one person can do. Perhaps we should remember the truth of that old nursery rhyme:  
For want of a nail, the shoe was lost.  
For want of a shoe, the horse was lost.  
For want of a rider, the battle was lost.  
For want of a battle, the war was lost.  
For want of a war, the kingdom was lost.  
And all for the loss of a horseshoe nail!  
Or...a pinch of salt!
