Outdoor Wedding In New York

Unites Dolch-Wilson Couple

Miss Frances Rebecca Wilson and Rev. Arthur George Dolch, both of Rochester, New York, were united in marriage at two-twenty in the afternoon on Saturday, August 16. The wedding took place in a wooded glade overlooking Echo Lake in the Adirondack Mountains of Speculator, New York.

The bride is the daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. Kelly J. Wilson, Jr. of Raeford. The groom is the son of the Rev. and Mrs. George W. Dolch of Cortland, New York.

The bride wore a full-length dress which she had made of ivory gabardine and lace.

The ceremony, written by the couple, included passages from the Old Testament read by the bride's father, and passages from the New

Testament read by the groom's father. The two mothers, Jean Lough Wilson and Dorothy Newton Dolch spoke words of welcome. Various friends and relatives read other selections. Anne Powers Coppenhaver of Brooklyn, New York read from "The Prophet" by Kahlil Gibran. John Wilson, brother of the bride, climbed a tree to read a Shakespearean love sonnet.

Rev. Paul Fattarusio of Rochester, associate pastor with the groom, Rev. Joel Wilcher of Johnstown, Pennsylvania, classmate of the groom, and Peter and Sara Watt Seward assisted in the ceremony. The bride's brothers, Rev. Jim Wilson of Clifton Springs, New York, and Rev. Kelly J. Wilson III, of Durham, administered the sacrament of holy communion.

Allyson Amey of Rochester, New York, played the guitar and sang the "Wedding Song" by Paul Stuckey. She was spontaneously accompanied in song by 3-year old Brian Bell.

Sheila Clawson, Rochester, New York craftswoman, made and presented the gold rings to the couple.

A long, white hanging, macramed by Rev. Doug Fox of Rochester swayed in the breeze behind the altar. Wildflowers decorated the altar as well as the outdoor sanctuary.

Over 200 guests, including seventeen ministers read the charge to the couple and pronounced them husband and wife.

The bride is a graduate of Duke University, Durham, North Carolina and will begin work on her masters of divinity at Colgate Rochester-Bexley Hall-Crozier Theological Seminary in the fall.

The groom is a graduate of West Virginia Wesleyan College and Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. He is presently the youth minister at Asbury First United Methodist Church, Rochester, New York.

After a wedding trip in New England, the couple will make their home in Rochester, New York.

Following the ceremony, the guests were entertained by a North Carolina "Pig Picking" engineered by the bride's father who roasted a full-size pig. Other guests and relatives brought salads and casseroles.
