For travel to the mountains the bride wore a blue and white pantsuit and the orchid from her bridal bouquet.

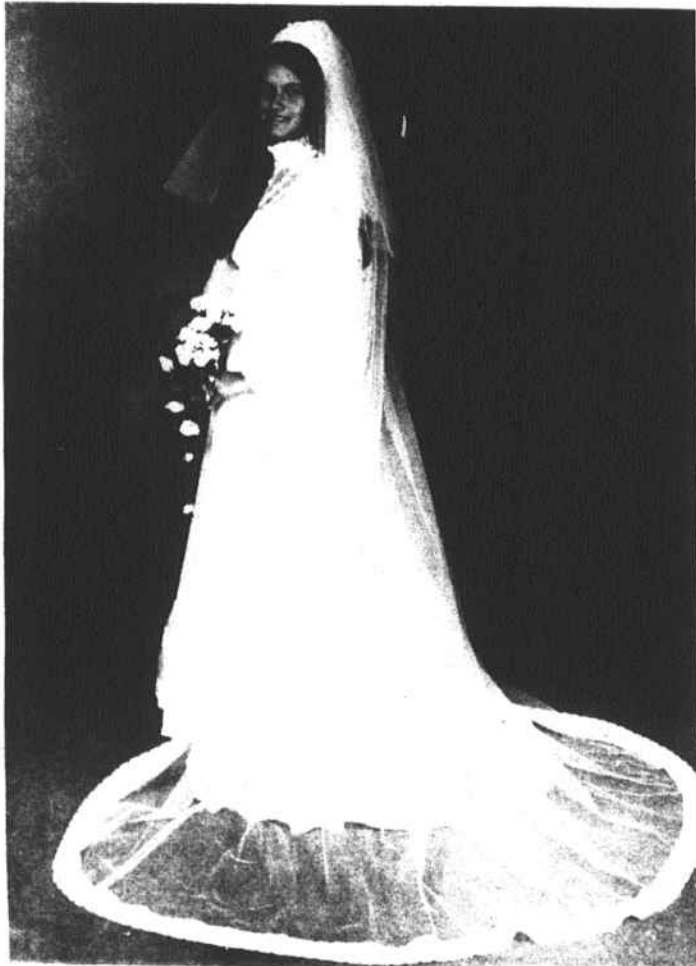
