Brantly Clark started the scoring off for the Bucks as he took a recovered fumble 52 yards for a touchdown with 5:08 remaining in the first quarter. A two point conversion attempt by quarterback David Howell was no good and Hoke held a 6-0 lead. Good defensive play by such players as Mike McIntosh and Larry Purcell kept the Devil's from scoring.

In the third quarter Leonard Everette scored for the Bucks with :59 showing on the clock. A 30 yard pass play set up the touchdown as McNeill hit receiver Jay Hottel. The two point conversion was good and Hoke had a 14-0 lead going into the fourth quarter. Fumbles and penalties slowed action in the last quarter as Hoke held on for the win. The next Jaycee game will be at Sanford September 25.

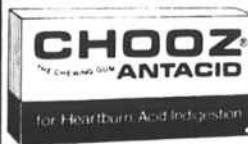
