Area members of the North Carolina Army National Guard traveled to Raleigh to discuss plans for next summer's two weeks of annual training with their Regular Army counterparts.

Lieutenant Colonel David McMillan of Fayetteville, the Commanding Officer of the Second Battalion, 252d Armor, met with Brigadier General Jack N. Merritt, the Assistant Division Commander, First Cavalry Division of Fort Hood, Texas.

An affiliation between a National Guard unit and a Regular Army unit means that in the event of a federal mobilization, the Guard unit would become a part of the federal unit.

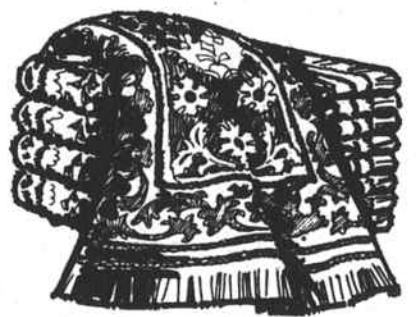
