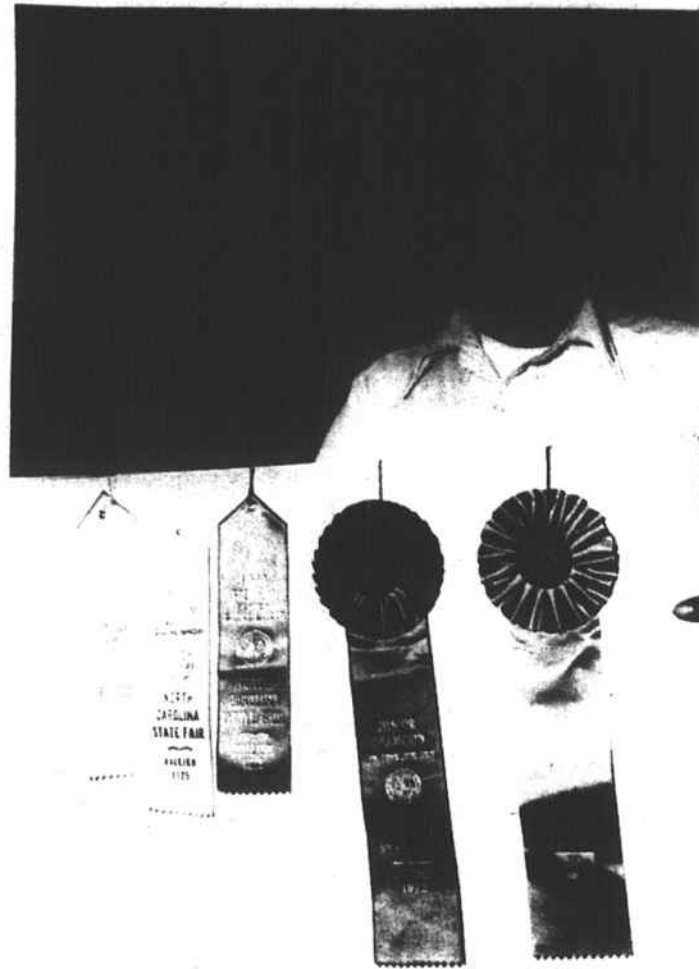
## Ashley Heights

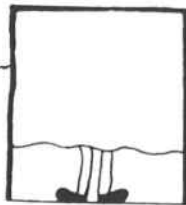
