General Fund Up

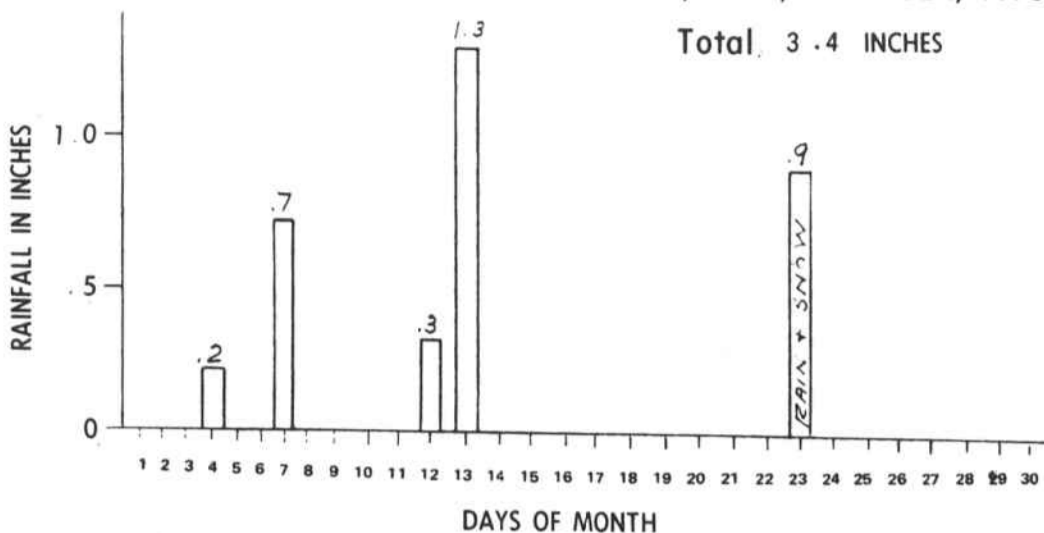
October 1975 net General Fund collections amounted to \$121.2 million as compared with \$101.9 million collected in October, 1974, an increase of 18.95%, according to the Department of Revenue report.

For the first four months of the current fiscal year, net General Fund collections were \$480.3 million compared with \$457.8 million for the first four months of the 1974-75 fiscal year, an increase of \$22.5 million or 4.93%.

October net Highway Fund collections amounted to \$25.9 million compared with \$22.4 million collected in October, 1974, an increase of \$3.5 million or 15.63%. Gasoline tax receipts amounted to \$23.4 million compared with \$20.9 million collected in October, 1974, an increase of \$2.5 million or 12.04%.

Net Highway Fund collections for the first four months of the current fiscal year were \$107.8 million as compared with \$99.2 million collected during the first four months of the 1974-75.
