King-Webb Wedding Held December 28

The church was decorated in Christmas colors. The altar featured white lighted candles in brass candelabra flanked by matching baskets of white gladioli with red and white carnations and greenery. Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a formal gown of bridal satin made by her mother. It was fashioned in the empire style with a stand-up collar, long gathered sheer sleeves and sheer yolk.
