other senator on the committee had a chance to examine his own FBI file Mine included derogatory information concerning somebody who was not anyone I could think of. I do not know how the error occurred but the FBI admitted that it was an error and the information pertained to someone else.

I suppose that I am just old

fashioned enough to feel that as long as a private citizen tends to his own business and obeys the law he has the right to be left alone by the bureaucrats in Washington.

Since I openly criticized the agency following these disclosures we have had mail from people in North Carolina questioning my actions. That's fair enough, because any person in public life who takes a stand can expect criticism.

And while I certainly stand by my original statement, and have no intention of being defensive about it, or withdrawing it one iota, I feel that one thing that I pointed out at the time should not be forgotten or lost sight of.

My criticism was aimed at the policy makers who direct the FBI in Washington, and was not directed t agents in the field, who take heir orders and do their jobs in a rofessional manner.

The FBI is needed in this nation But it is needed to deal with criminals, and not to keep files or meddle with the lives and actions of ordinary citizens who obey the law and want to be left alone
