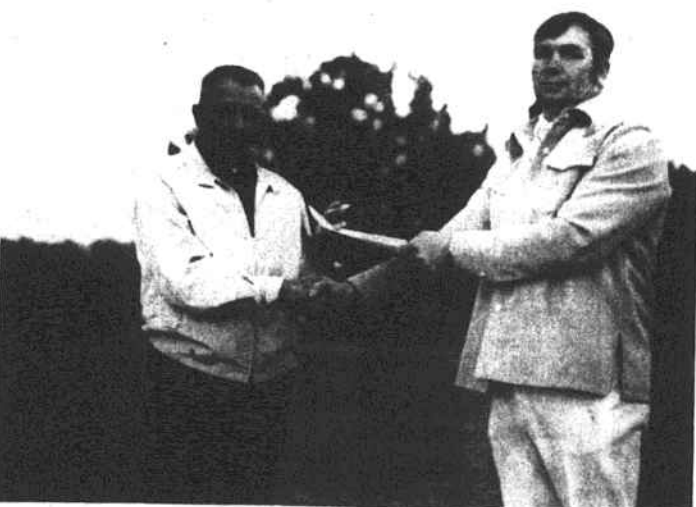
Williamson Cops Tourney
