Later, it was decided that a more appropriate place would be nearer the center of the state and the Asheboro area was decided upon.

It was A.D. Peacock who started Boys' Home at Lake Waccamaw which has helped hundreds of boys to get back on the right track. Within the next year Girls' Haven hopes to establish a second home in the Rocky Mount area. John Kapla of Rocky Mount is chairman of the Girls' Haven Board; Amos Butler of Roseboro is president. Other officers are David Parker, first vice president; Mrs. Lark Newsom, Jr., second vice president; Mrs. Carl Kearnes, secretary; Ogburn Yates, assistant secretary and Hiram Currell, treasurer. If given the same support which has been afforded Boys' Home, Girls' Haven can be of great help for girls who need an uplifting home. Mike Quinto is executive director of Girls' Home.

now be bused to West Hoke School.

In other business, the board awarded a contract to Jack Mannes, general contractors in Denton, for a new eighth grade building at Upchurch Junior High. Cost is \$9,500. The board also agreed to purchase 1,000 chairs at a cost of \$6,000 on a state contract for the new gymnasium at the high school.

The board officially adopted a new policy recommended by the State Department of Public Instruction on student's cumulative folders. According to Autry, under the new plan, the 12 year folder will contain greater detail and will bar "general comments" from a student's teachers.

Two bids were accepted by the board and a third rejected on three portable classroom units which are offered at public auction earlier this month. A high bid of \$1,575 from Annie B. Locklear and a high bid of \$1,075 from Arthur Kemp were approved on two units. A high bid of \$1,550 from Mrs. J.K. Riley on a third unit was rejected and the board offered to sell it for \$2,000, after Autry said the unit was only three years old. Mrs. Riley agreed to pay the new price.

Nine teachers were approved for the 1976-77 school year: Diane Smith (interim); Betty Russell; Darlene R. Clark; Maurine McCadden; Faye Best; Sharon Ashburn (interim); Phyllis D. Jones; Ethelene H. Baker; and Sarah H. Woodard. Mary James was approved as a secretary and Debbie Little, Della Hasegawa, Kay Myers, Sarah Beatty and Ruth Leslie were approved as teacher's aides.

wright said the ordinance covers policies on vacation, sick leave, probationary employment and dismissals and is intended to inform each employee of practices which have been observed in the past, but were not formally written. The new ordinance also details what information may be made available to the public.

In other business, the council: Appointed Duncan McFadyen Jr., an attorney, to the Raeford Housing Authority to fill out the term of Ken McNeill who resigned last spring, and appointed McNeill to the city planning board (inside) to fill W.L. Howell, Jr.'s seat;

Approved a contract with Wachovia Bank and Trust Co. to handle the city's bonds for a one year period at a cost of about \$50;

Discussed a drainage problem in the Holly Park area after residents complained of flooding to city hall after the last heavy rain but took no action on the matter;

Received notice of an offer from Walter D. Brown to sell the city a 50 by 150 foot section on Main St. for \$40,000, for possible use as a parking lot, but tabled any decision on the offer;

Approved plans for a nine-unit mobile home park in the Queenmore section on land owned by realtor Julian Wright;

Approved a transfer of \$5,500 in the budget to cover a delay in the reimbursement payment for the Title X storm drainage grant.
