The Christian Women's Club is a national association of interdenominational women which meets for luncheon once a month in many of the leading cities and areas throughout this country and Canada.

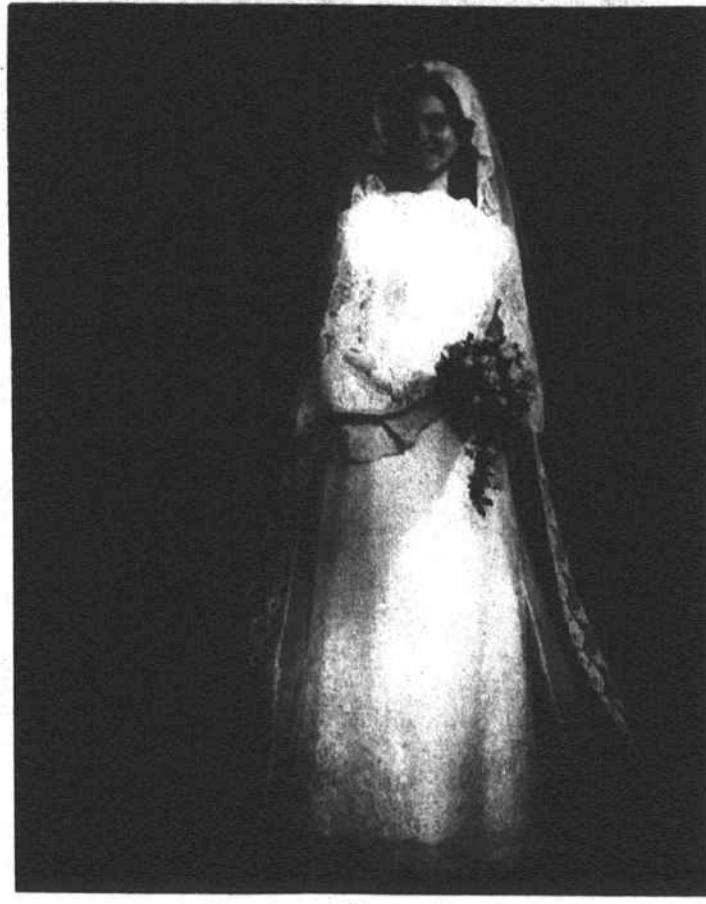
# Wrights Honored On Anniversary
