## Hoke ASCS

The following changes have been made in the flue-cured tobacco program which are effective immediately: **REPORT REQUIRED** - Planted acreage of tobacco must be reported in the county ASCS office no later than June 14. **PRICE SUPPORT** - Farmers who plant in excess of 110 percent of the effective allotment WILL NOT be eligible for price support. **LEASES AFTER JUNE 14** - The poundage which may be leased from a farm after June 14 is limited to the difference between the expected production and the actual production. The expected production is determined by multiplying the established farm yield times the planted acreage.

The poundage which may be leased to a farm after June 14 is limited to the difference between the effective quota and the pounds to be marketed. In addition, the acreage planted on each farm involved in leasing after June 14 must be at least 50 percent of the allotment except when the effective quota on the transferring farm is 2,000 pounds or less.

Your planted acreage may be measured and an estimate of production may be necessary before a lease is approved.

**MEASUREMENT SERVICE** - It is very important that your tobacco acreage be reported accurately and as soon as possible after planting is complete. If you desire measurement service, the cost will be \$4.00 per farm plus \$1.50 per acre with a minimum of \$11.50 per farm. If you have any questions regarding these changes, please come to the county ASCS office.

**FARM STORAGE AND DRYING EQUIPMENT LOAN PROGRAM** - Producers are reminded of the changes in the program for on-the-farm storage and drying one.

1. Storage need determined on two years production instead of one.

The Beekeeper Indemnity Payment Program has been changed some for the calendar year 1977. This program is administered by the ASCS office.

Tobacco growers are encouraged to attend and show your support of the tobacco program.

Beekeepers are no longer required to register the number and locations of their beehives on an annual basis. If a loss is suffered, he will register the affected colonies at the time he files. The ASCS inspectors will no longer charge for the inspections to verify losses. All inspections will be made by ASCS and the N.C. Department of Agriculture will no longer be involved.
