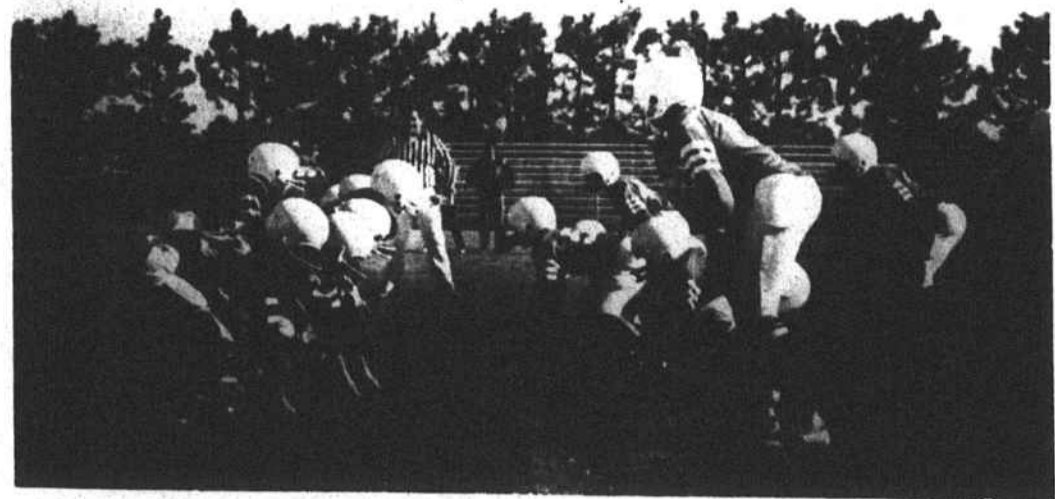

After the McMillian interception Hoke took over on their own 15. Everette broke through for a 45-yard gallop to put Hoke at Cary's 40. This drive was stalled by another fumble on the next play.

Cary managed to score on each possession and led 21-0 at the half. Hoke received the second half
