Handicapped Services Subject Of Meetings

Regional parent conferences on services for handicapped children will be held in nine North Carolina locations Saturday, Dec. 3, for parents of handicapped children, professionals, and other interested persons in the Hoke County area. The conference location will be at the Sheraton Motor Inn in Fayetteville. Registration starts at 8:30 a.m., with sessions scheduled from 9 a.m. through 12:30 p.m.

The conferences, sponsored by the Division for Exceptional Chil-

dren, State Department of Public Instruction, have been planned on a regional basis to make meetings easily accessible for participants, to pinpoint services available in each area, and to allow informal exchange among parents, educators, and other service providers. The Dec. 3 meetings are a follow-up to similar statewide Parent Conferences which were held last May.

According to Director of the Division for Exceptional Children, Theodore R. Drain, the purpose of the meetings is to share with participants the provisions of new state and federal laws affecting programs for the handicapped and to assist them in understanding the many services available in their schools and from other community and state agencies. Sessions also will address the importance of family involvement in the success of educational programs for the handicapped, and special problems of children with specific handicaps.

Thacker will be allowed to rent that hangar from the city for \$1 a year for the first five years and for the fair market value the next five years. The motion also included the purchase of three tracts of land needed for further development.

Councilmen Sam Morris and Benny McLeod cast the dissenting votes, according to minutes of the meeting.

VANCE REQUEST

Before the council went into executive session, Gene Vance, owner of Vance Aircraft Sales, requested that the city give him a permanent lease so he could expand his business at the airport to include flight instruction and airplane rentals. He told the board that he intended to spend about \$100,000 in expansion.

The city manager argued against Vance's request, saying that more than one fixed base operator at the airport would complicate management of the facility. He told the board that expansion at the airport would mean added cost to the city. The city gets no tax revenues from the airport, he said.

AIRPORT HISTORY

The Raeford airport, which began in the early 1960's as a Chamber of Commerce project, was virtually unused until Gene Thacker began his parachute school there in 1969, according to a report appearing in a back issue of *The News-Journal*. In 1974, pilots reportedly alleged that jumpers created a safety hazard at the field, a charge which Thacker denied.

Thacker, a former Army man, was a member of the famed Golden Knights parachute team and won awards in world competition. He coached the U.S. Olympic Parachute Team in 1966.

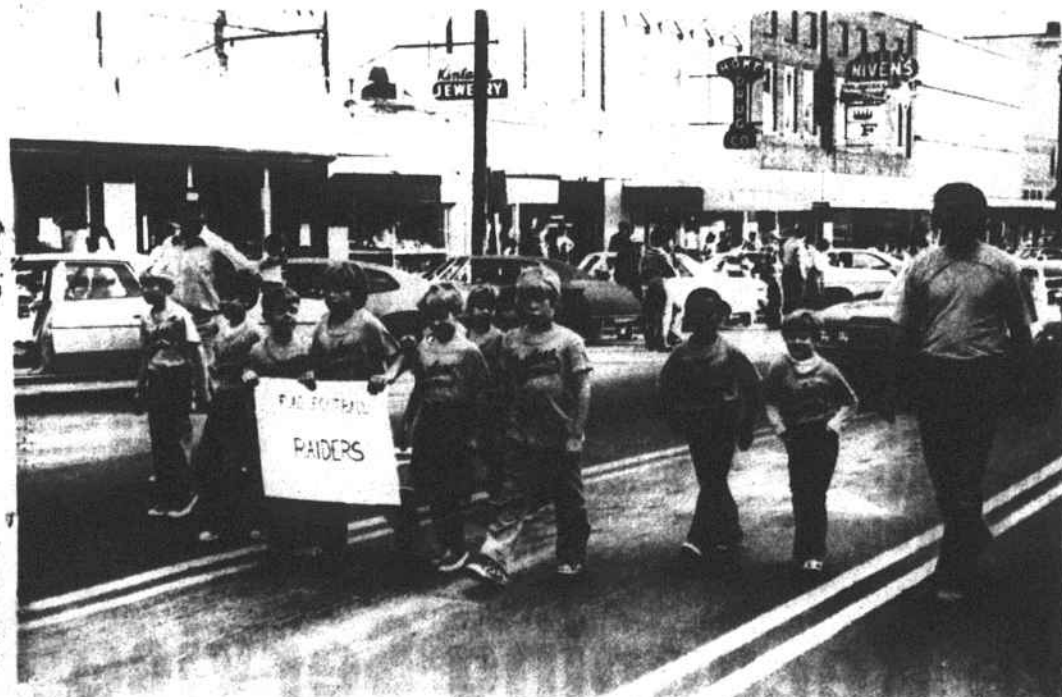
