James Cobb is a native of Memphis, Tenn., the son of a Presbyterian minister. He gradu-ated from Southwestern at Memphis, Boston University, and the University of Illinois, from which he holds the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree. His first teaching position was at Flora MacDonald College, where he was a member of the music faculty and director of the Flora MacDonald Choir.
