Multiple Charges Bring Sentence

Charges of driving under the influence, (D.U.I.) following too closely, no operator's license and refusing to give name and address to officers resulted in a sentence of seven months in last Thursday's District Court session.

Rogers Franklin Byrum, Charlotte, entered a plea of guilty to all charges before Judge Joseph Dupree. His Breathalyzer reading was .15%. He was sentenced to four months on the charges of D.U.I. and following too closely. A sentence of three months was imposed on the charges of no operator's license and failing to give officers his name and address. The second sentence was set to begin at the expiration of the first.

Wilbert McCrimmon, Rt. 1 Box 236, Red Springs, received a voluntary dismissal on a charge of speeding 62 in a 55 m.p.h. zone. He entered a plea of guilty to D.U.I. Breathalyzer reading was .27%. He was sentenced to 90 days, suspended for 18 months, provided he surrender his license and drive only as set out in the order granting limited driving privilege. He was ordered to pay a \$150 fine and cost.

For good cause shown, \$50 of the fine was remitted.
