Bucks Stage Strong Comeback

The Hoke County Bucks defeated the Richmond County Raiders in a non-conference game this week 64 - 58 to end the early part of the season with a record of 4 - 1.

Playing aggressively on defense and scoring from long range, the Raiders tested the Bucks early as they took command of the game the first two quarters and went in at the half leading 29 - 37. Stubbs

collected 21 of his 27 points in the first half as the Bucks seemed unable to contain him or get the offense going.

But the third period proved that the Bucks were ready for a comeback. Picking up the tempo with aggressive defensive play and strong inside play, the Bucks outscored the Raiders 17 to 7, to take a 2 - point lead into the fourth quarter.

Mark Wood picked up Stubbs

and kept him in check for the third and fourth quarters as he only scored six points in the second half. Dennis Purcell paced the Bucks scoring with 18 points, followed by Andre Cobb with 12 points, Harold Thompson with 11 points, Calvin Blue with eight points, Mark Wood with six points, Nathan McNeill with five points, and Leonard Everette and Alwertha Galberth with two points each.

The Bucks' next opponent will be

the Lee County Yellow Jackets at Sanford on Tuesday, Jan. 3, as they begin conference play in the tough Southeastern 4-A.

On Jan. 6, the Bucks will meet the Raiders again here on their home court. The Bucks will also play at home on Jan. 10, when they face Lumberton.

The next two games will be on the road, at Pinecrest on Jan. 13 and at Seventy - First on Jan. 14.

Realty, Needlework Classes Scheduled

A 45 - hour course in real estate will begin at Hoke High School Jan. 3, sponsored through Sandhills Community College.

The course is designed to provide the beginner and real estate practitioner with a basic knowledge of real estate. It includes the fundamentals of real estate, brokerage, financing, appraising, real property law, real estate math, construction, and mechanics of closing.

Successful completion of this course is acceptable by the North Carolina Real Estate Licensing Board in lieu of the "six months experience" requirements.

The course will meet each Tuesday and Thursday from 7 - 10 p.m., beginning Jan. 3, and ending Feb. 9. Students must attend at least 80 percent of the classes to pass the course. Jerry Daeke, local real estate dealer, will teach the class.

The class is sponsored through the Continuing Education Dept. of Sandhills Community College and any adult may register the first night of class. A \$5 registration fee will be charged, and books may be purchased at the class.

Mrs. Woodyard will also teach two classes in painting which will begin Jan. 5. They will meet from 1 - 4 p.m. and 6 - 9 p.m. each Thursday in the Old County Office Building. The classes are sponsored by Sandhills Community College and any adult may enroll. Registration fee is \$5. Students will have to purchase instructional materials also.
