### Housing Tips

As a homeowner, it might be desirable to place a value on trees and shrubs for insurance or legal purposes.

Later on if you are trying to recover damages to your trees and shrubs by means of a lawsuit, you will need to get an evaluation from an expert. Acceptable experts for court purposes are consulting arborists (ARE-BORE-ISTS), consulting foresters and representatives of tree service firms.

If you are trying to recover damages by means of an insurance claim, you will need to check first with your insurance agent to determine if such damage is covered by your policy. If the damages are covered, the loss or reduction in the fair market value of your property must be determined by a real estate appraiser. The maximum allowable insurance claim in North Carolina is \$200 per plant.

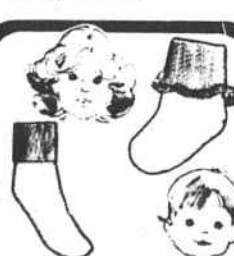

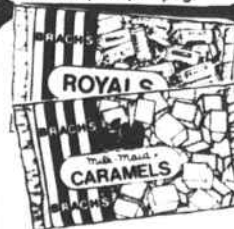

**Important: Remember these sun facts**

The sun can be a demon to your health. Read and remember these pointers:

Sunlight may help fight eczema, psoriasis, acne, and a few other skin ailments, but using the wrong sun lotion could aggravate these conditions. . . Time in the water is considered time in the sun. . . Tee-shirts reduce sunlight by 50%. . . Sunlight discolors dyed hair, so wear a scarf. . . Hazy days burn just as readily as clear days. . . Some medications give patients adverse reactions to sunlight exposure.

For home treatments for sunburn, take a cool bicarbonate bath, use calamine lotion or powder. Aspirin may help, also.

Note: Patients on the following drugs should first consult their doctor before staying out in the sun: phenylsulfonyleurea, promethazine, chlorpromazine, chlorazepate, poralens, demeclocycline, erythromycin, griseofulvin, tetracycline, quinidine, quinine, sulfas, barbiturates and antimicrobial and hypoglycemic sulfonamides.
