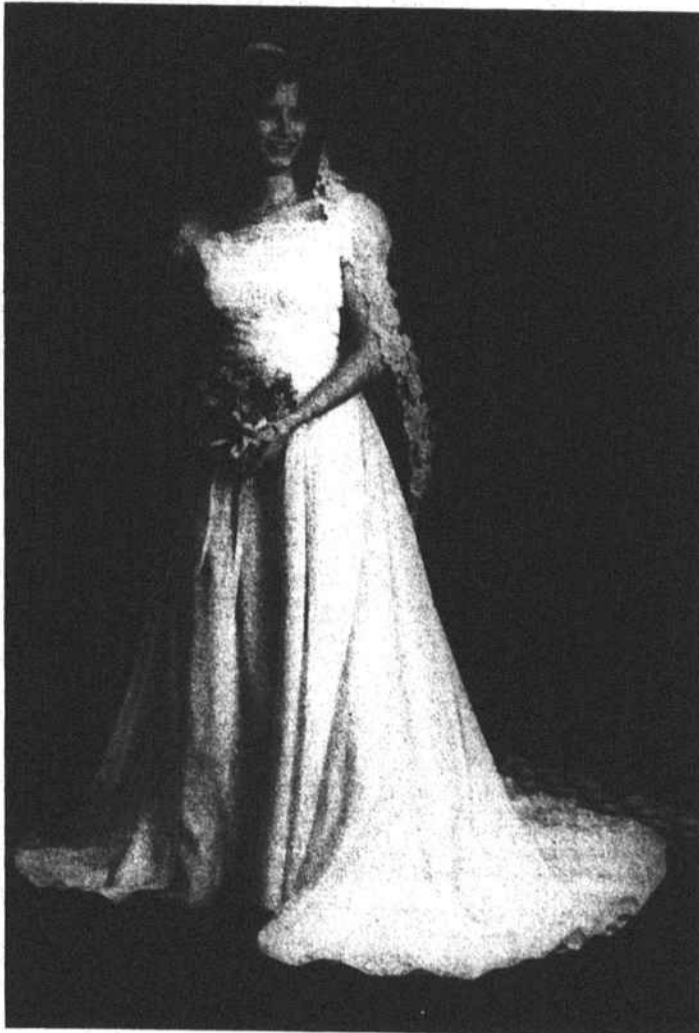

Guests were greeted by Mr. and Mrs. Raz Autry, and Mr. and Mrs. Robert Barch.

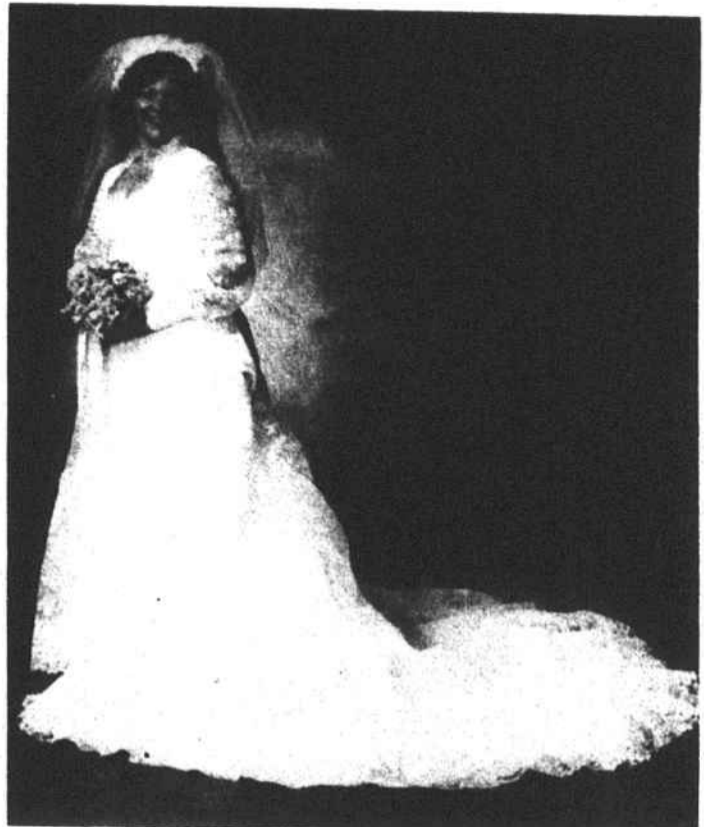
The bride's register was kept by Miss Elaine Surlis, of Fayetteville, and Miss Susan Cook of Raeford.
