# Bucks Open Cage Season With Victory

Hoke High's Bucks opened their 1981-82 basketball season successfully last week in their home gym, walloping Cape Fear 67-46.

Hoke took the lead early and were never behind, leaving the court at half time with the score 33-17. Hoke's Greg Hollingsworth led the winners; scoring, contributing 20 points. Cape Fear's James Rhone was the game's top indi-

vidual scorer with 21 but was the losers' only double-digit contributor.

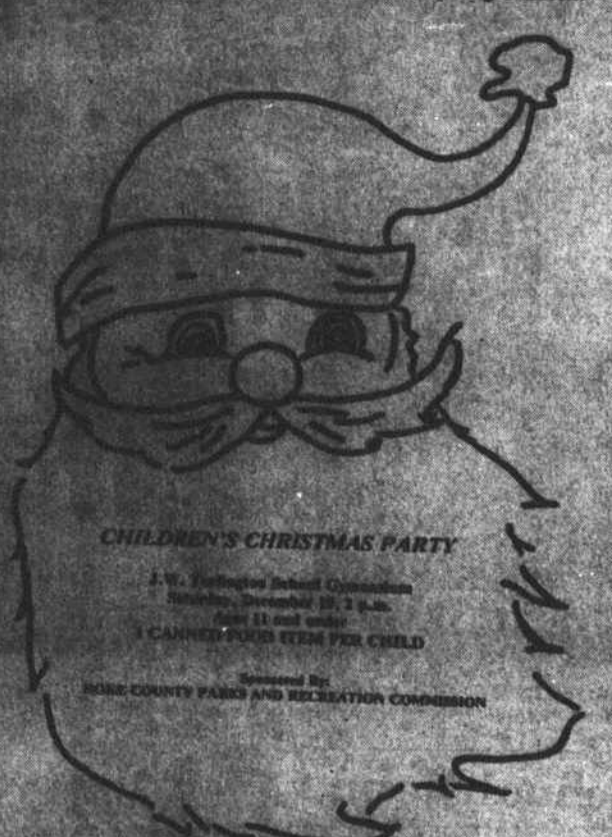
