Speeding, DUI, Marijuana Cases Heard

The following judgments were issued Thursday in Hoke County District Court by Judge Joseph E. Dupree.

Ronald Dean Grant, Rockingham, exceeding a safe speed, \$50 cash bond ordered returned to the defendant and service fee for order for arrest remitted on finding that the defendant subsequent to the order for arrest pleaded guilty by way of waiver, and paid costs.

Rufus Kirkman, Jr., Laurinburg, speeding 67 in a 55 zone, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

John M. Christian, Fayetteville, speeding 66 in a 55 zone, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Robert L. Jones, Rt. 2, Laurel Hill, driving under the influence and no operator's license, 90 days suspended for 12 months, probation for 12 months, \$150 and costs, and not drive for 12 months.

Nathaniel Jackson Lanier, Jr., Raeford, speeding 65 in a 55 zone, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Timothy Dial, Rt. 2, Robersonville, possession of marijuana, \$50 and costs.

Edward Lee Moore, Rt. 1, Red Springs, no operator's license, \$25 and costs.

Harold G. Koch, Raeford, failing to stop at a stop sign, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

James David Thomas, Rt. 4, Raeford, failing to stop at the scene of an accident, defendant's motion for arrest of judgment is granted.

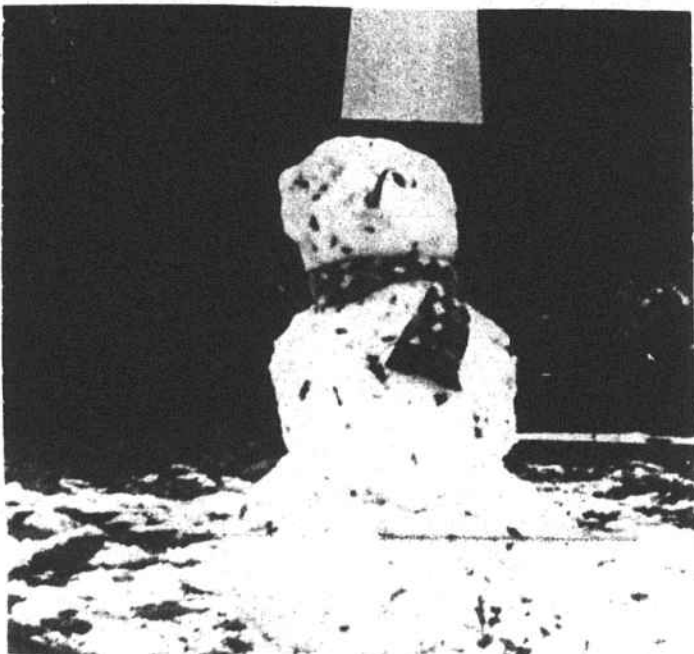

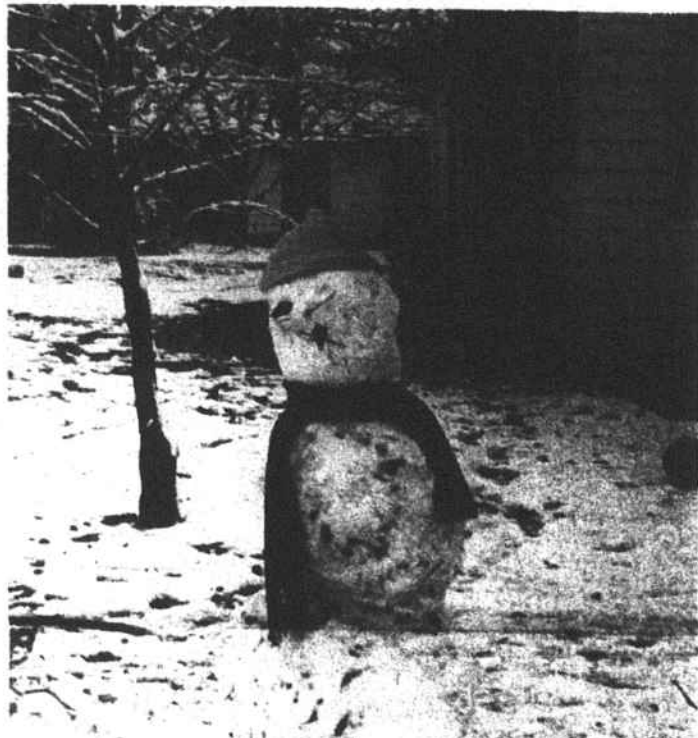
Snow, Cold, Followed By Snowmen
