Wright and Boyles get together with the county manager and resolve the tie by a method to be agreed on by all three. This could be for examples, simply by tossing a coin or drawing straws, or by splitting the quota.

The other bidder for the quota was David S. Currie, Jr., of Rt. 2, Raeford, who offered 38,408 cents per pound. The total payments would be \$615 each by Wright and Boyles, and would have been \$588.30 by Currie.
