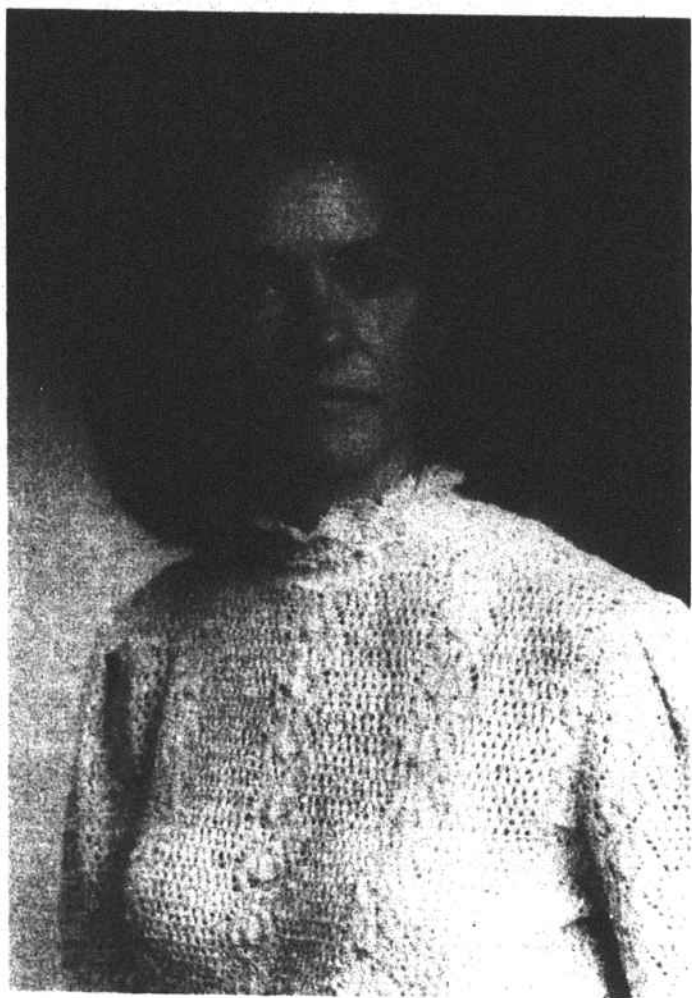
The families of the bridal couple hosted a reception at the home of the bride following the private ceremony.

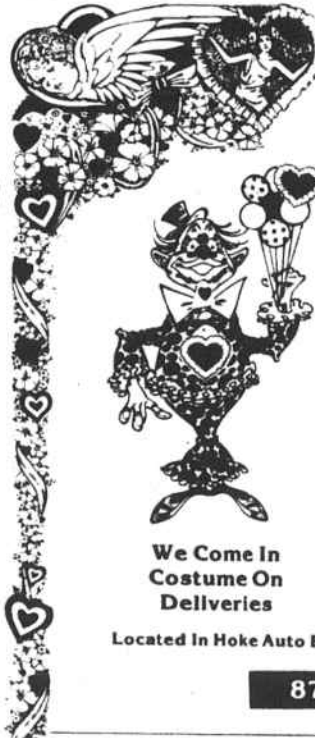
