

Hoke Varsities Down Pinecrest

Hoke County High School's varsity boys and girls downed the Pinecrest High teams last week on

the Hoke court, but the Pinecrest JVs turned back the Hoke JVs 71-69.

The Hoke boys won, 69-59, after being one point behind at half time, and the Hoke girls turned back the visiting girls 41-31 with a third-quarter surge in an otherwise even game.

The results brought the Bucks to a 7-3 Southeastern Conference record and 10-8 over-all, and the Hoke girls to 8-2 and 13-5 marks. The victory also left the Hoke boys alone in second place in the conference standings. Hoke had shared the runnerup spot with E.E. Smith but Smith lost 39-37 to Lumberton the same night Hoke was beating Pinecrest. Hoke and Smith met Tuesday on the Hoke court.

In the boys' game at Hoke, Greg Hollingsworth scored 31 points for the winners, the highest individual total for the contest, and Hoke's Sabrina Barnes was tops in the girls' game with 14 points.

Among the JVs, Charles Headen of Pinecrest was top scorer with 22, and Kevin Gay with 12 led the Hoke individual efforts.

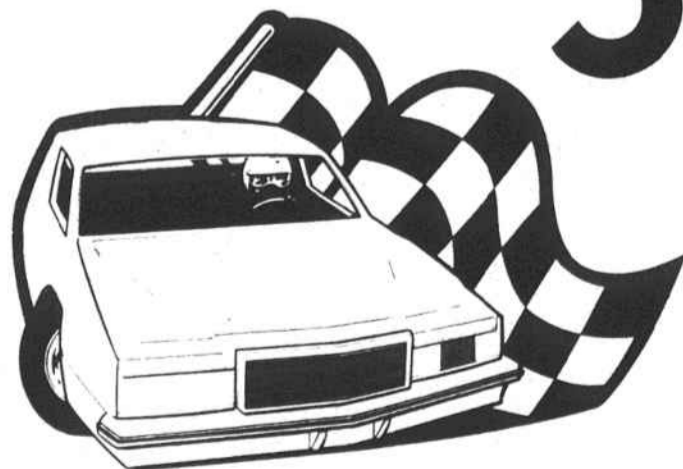
