

Girls Edge Scotland, Boys Beat Lumberton

Hoke Teams Win Tourney Openers

Hoke High's boys' and girls' basketball teams advanced to the second rounds of the Southeastern 4-A Conference tournaments last week on first-round victories.

The girls edged Scotland 41-39 February 22 on the margin of two free throws by Brenda Blue in the last 11 seconds. The boys defeated Lumberton 61-49 the next night. Both games were played on the Hoke court.

The boys' teams broke even in their two regular season contest, with the Bucks winning the first 54-53, and Lumberton the second, 66-62, February 19 the last game of Hoke's regular season.

Greg Hollingsworth scored 16 and Eldred Blue 15 for the winners, and Richard Hobbs was high for Lumberton with 15.

The results left Hoke with an 11-10 record against all opponents and 7-5 in conference play this season. Hoke, Lumberton and Scotland finished the regular season in a tie for third place in the conference standings with a 7-5 record each.

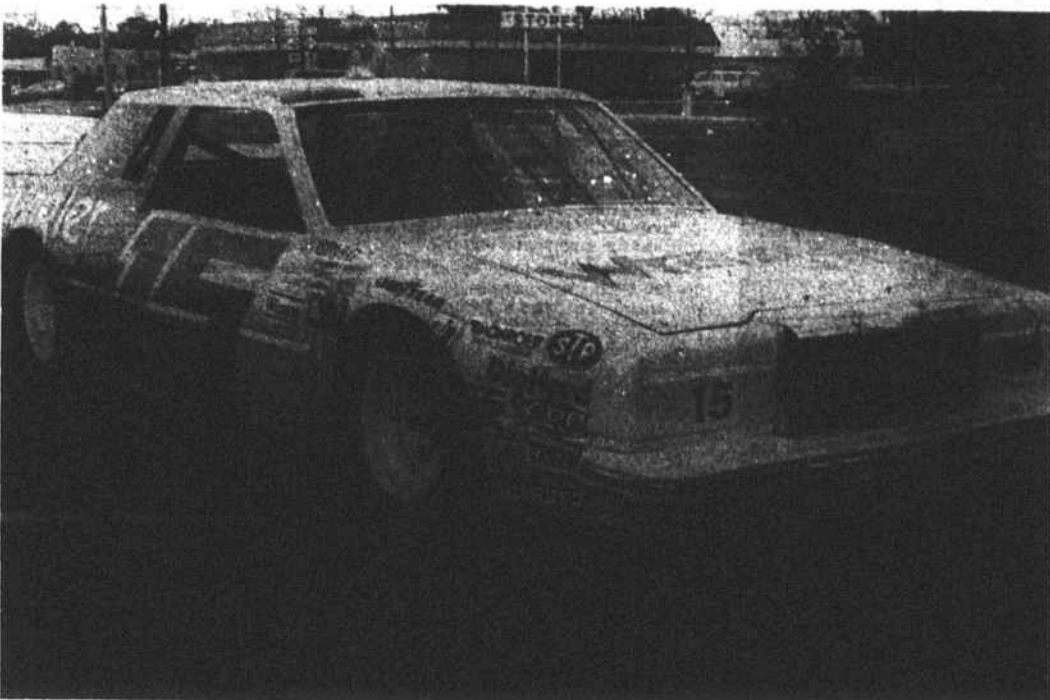
The Scotland girls came from behind a 10-point disadvantage in nearly snatching victory.

Aerobic exercise is the type which steadily supplies enough oxygen to the working muscles for as long as the exercise is performed.

Any rhythmic, repetitive, dynamic activity which can be sustained for several minutes without halting and putting stress on the joints is aerobic. Aerobic exercise incorporates running with various jogging, hopping and skipping.

The class will be in the instructor. She will be using the Aerobic Dance Program by Jackie Scrivener.
