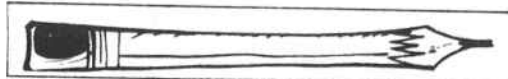
Terri Clark was awarded a first runner-up trophy in the General Merchandising oral event and a first runner-up trophy in the overall General Merchandising Series.
