# AFDC, Food Stamp Restitution Pay Set

The following Hoke County Superior Court judgments were issued last week. Judge Wiley F. Bowen presided over the one-week criminal term.

Gloria Robinson, P.O. Box 1151, Raeford, pleaded guilty to two counts of larceny by trick, three years suspended, probation, pay \$904 restitution to the Hoke County

Department of Social Services for Aid to Families with Dependent Children program, and \$722 to Hoke County DSS for the federal food stamp program, and court costs.

Willie Lee Stanley, Box 265 Raeford, five counts of uttering forged checks, two years, credited

with 62 days in custody awaiting trial, as a condition of work release, the defendant is to make \$150 restitution to Cole's Food Store, \$90 restitution to Home Food Market, and \$60 restitution to A&P of Raeford.

Jethro Thomas, Rt. 4, Red Springs, breaking and entering, and larceny, and assault with a deadly weapon, pleaded guilty to felony breaking and entering, and to misdemeanor assault with a deadly weapon, three years; the defendant is ordered to get his high school diploma or GED high school equivalency, and is committed initially to Central Prison in Raleigh for medical and psychiatric examination, and if required, treatment.

Debra Bratcher, Rt. 1, Raeford, violation of the noise ordinance, costs.

Clarence Bratcher, Rt. 1, Raeford, violation of the noise ordinance, and two counts of resisting an officer, pleaded guilty, costs.

James Black, Rt. 1, Red Springs, violation of the noise ordinance, pleaded guilty, costs.

James C. Sanderson, assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill, inflicting serious injury, six years suspended for five years, pay all

uninsured medical expenses of Robert Lee resulting from the offense, but not limited to \$5,865.78 presented last week, and pay a \$200 fine, and court costs, and secure a high school diploma or GED high school equivalency by January 1, 1983.

Curtis Van Allen Ray, 809 Carolina Dr., Raeford, larceny, found not guilty by a jury.

John L. McLean, Rt. 1, Box 99, Red Springs, unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, 12 to 24 months suspended for two years, probation, costs, and learn to write his name within six months.

Nathaniel Brown, Box 605, Raeford, driving license revoked, and no financial responsibility, one year, suspended, \$200 and costs.

Larry R. Adams, Box 68, Lumber Bridge, charged with driving under the influence, fourth offense, and driving while license revoked, pleaded guilty to driving with a blood-alcohol level of .10% or more, and driving while license revoked, six months on the alcohol charge and 24 months to the license charge, suspended, two years probation, \$300 and costs, and enroll and complete alcohol-abuse programs on direction of the probation officer.
