The pastor is Eldress Eloise Campbell.

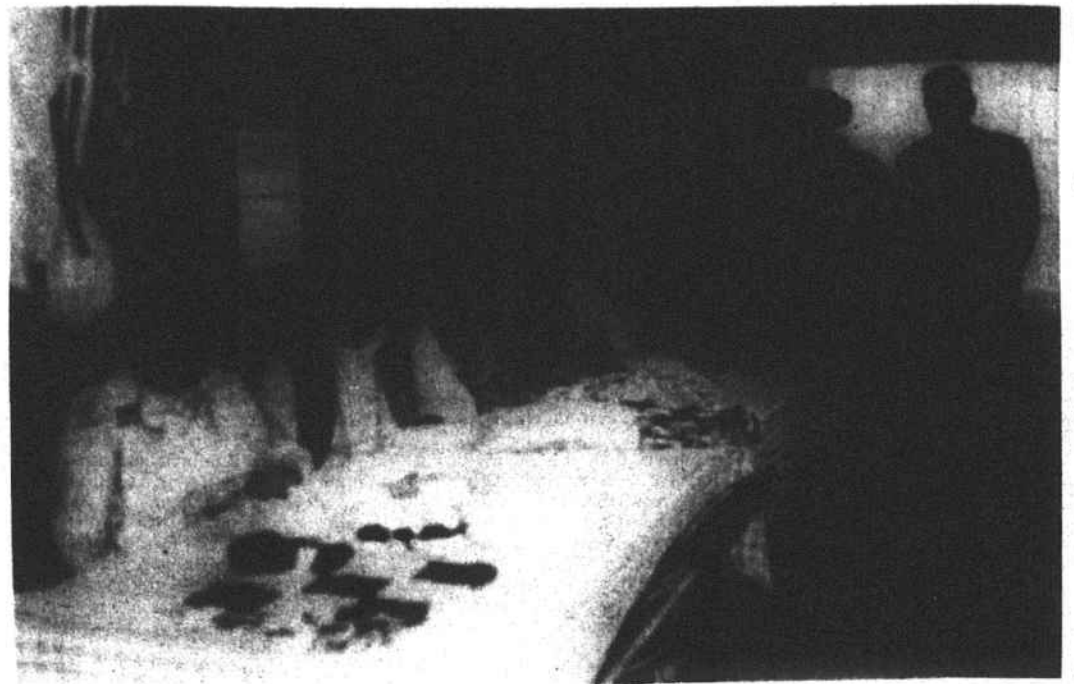
