

# Hoke Track Team Third In Meet

The Hoke High boys' track team had a strong race but finished third in the recent triangular meet with Terry Sanford and Scotland County.

Sanford won with 77 1/2 points, Scotland was runnerup with 54 1/2, and Hoke finished with 45 1/2.

Daryl Cromartie and Paul Hunt led the Bucks in points with 8 each.

Cromartie won the discus with a throw of 125 feet 9 1/2 inches and placed second in the shot put with a throw of 44 feet 5 inches.

Hunt won the two mile run with a time of 10:08.7 and placed second in the mile with 4:45.

Ronnie McRae scored six points by finishing third in the 800 meter, mile and two mile runs.

Willie Bridges won the 400 meter dash with 52.4 seconds.

The mile relay team, continuing to improve, placed second with 3:40 minutes.

First quality at the outlets can be samples, overruns, overstock, discontinued styles, or last season's goods. And irregulars can give you even greater savings. Also, some outlets have a "featured item of the week" and from time to time other special promotions which can save you additional money off the outlet's already low prices.

What are examples of some of these tremendous savings awaiting you? One chain of 18 clothing factory outlets is the Oxford Sportswear Outlets, and at their store in Hamlet, N.C. we recently found blouses that normally retail for a whopping \$30 for only \$8; \$40 pants for only \$12; and \$90 blazer jackets for only \$18. This is hard to imagine, but it's fact! For the senior citizens Oxford offers a special 10% discount daily. Their stores are clean, well lighted, and surprisingly attractive compared to some of the outlets we've visited.

It's about time consumers are getting a break. With inflation making paupers of us all, this good news about the factory outlets is a welcome change!
