

## Hoke To Participate In Volunteers Awards

The Hoke County Involvement Council announced today it would participate in the 1982 Governor's Volunteer Awards.

The selection process will be conducted by the selection committee's review of nominations received from the community at large.

## School Board Starts Work On Budget

The Hoke County Board of Education did preparatory work on a school system budget for 1982-83 at a special meeting last week.

Don Steed, county schools business manager, and County Schools Supt. Raz Autry provided explanations on details.

No action was taken.

In other business, the board voted approval of tenure for Christy Posey, a Hoke County High School teacher. The board approved tenure at its regular meeting of April 6 for 10 other Hoke High teachers -- Ginger Johnson, G. Ashley, S.

Davis, S. Parsons, C. Walls, E. Snead, W. Barnhill, D. Poole, M. Brown, and V. Wiles. At the regular meeting also, approval for tenure was given a Scurlock School teacher, who teaches at South Hoke School; three at West Hoke and one at Upchurch Junior High.

Teachers are on probationary status till they obtain three years' professional experience in one school system or a total of five years' experience in more than one.

Tenure provides a teacher with official professional status, which carries the protections provided professional educators by the State

Teacher Tenure Act.

At the April 6 meeting also, the school board approved a switch in jobs for Woodrow Westall and Frank H. Richards. Richards will become principal of South Hoke School, and Westall director of community-school services, which includes supervision of the school bus system. Westall was transferred to the South Hoke position from the principalship of West Hoke School, and Richards was transferred to the community-school post from the assistant principalship of Scurlock School last year.

During the meeting also it was noted that Hoke County's Arts and Crafts Festival, Celebration of the Arts '82, held Hoke High, Upchurch Junior High, and Turlington School and in public areas off school grounds April 3-9 was financed by a \$10,000 state grant and a \$35,000 grant made by the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation of Winston-Salem.

## Norton Honored For Stage Work

Dan Norton of Raeford was honored recently for his performance in "Showboat" at the Bordeaux Dinner Theatre in Fayetteville.

"Showboat" now holds the record as the longest running show in North Carolina history. Dan portrayed the jovial "Captain Andy" to rave reviews in 54 consecutive performances.

"Showboat" also holds the record as the most successful production ever at Bordeaux, having been seen by over 11,000 patrons in its 10-week run.

Norton has achieved star status at Bordeaux with leading roles in "Camelot", "Oliver", and "I Love My Wife" and can presently be seen in the role of "Moonface Martin" in Cole Porter's musical comedy "Anything Goes."

Dan's portrayal of Moonface, who in the show is Public Enemy #13, is in direct contrast with his professional duties as a rehabilitation therapist with the Department of Correction at McCain Correctional Center.

Norton also played a lead in the Raeford Junior Woman's Club's 1980 production, "Little Mary Sunshine."

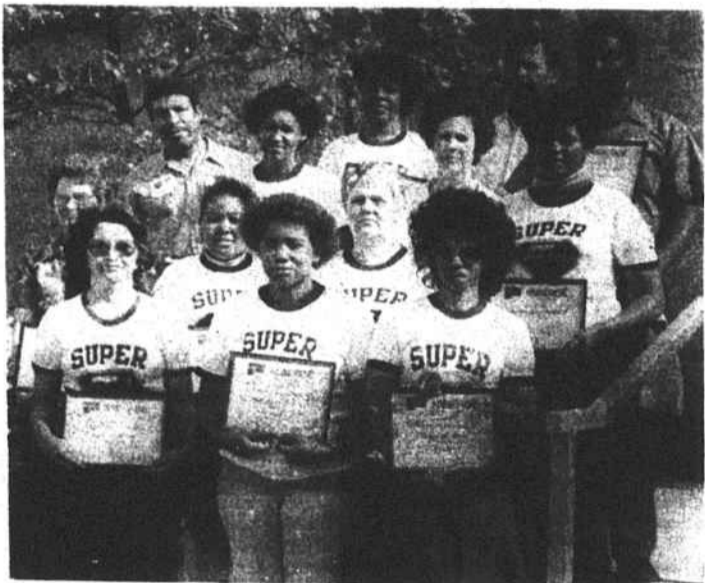

## 'Breath Of Spring' Run May 1 In Moore

The Fourth annual "Breath of Spring" Lung Run in Moore County will be held Saturday, May 1, at Seven Lakes in western Moore County just off N.C. 211 eight miles west of Pinehurst.

Starting time is 10 a.m. at the Seven Lakes Clubhouse where registration will open at 9 a.m.

There will be a 10-kilometer (6.2-mile) run, a 3-mile Run and a One Mile Walk/Run. Entry fees, which are tax deductible are \$5 for the 10 KM Run; \$4 for the 3-Mile; and \$3 for the Fun Run/Walk.

All participants will receive a pair of "Lung Run" socks, a Certificate of Participation and awards will be given to the top three finishers in the one-mile run/walk. In the 10-KM and 3-Mile runs, gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded to the top three overall finishers. Additional awards will go to the top three finishers in each group for both men and boy in

various age categories.

Moore County Parks and Recreation Department is co-sponsoring the event with Seven Lakes and the American Lung Association of N.C., Mid-State Region. Proceeds will benefit the youth education program and patient service work of the Lung Association in the Mid-State Region.
