Icesonnia Horsley, 14, entered the Junior Strider Invitational Meet Competitions and began the season with four wins.

Eagles Appeals Court Candidate

Raleigh attorney Sidney S. Eagles, Jr., is a candidate for the North Carolina Court of Appeals seat being vacated by Judge Robert Martin.

A partner in the Raleigh law firm of Eagles, Hafer and Hall, Eagles was formerly counsel to the Speaker of the House and earlier had been a special deputy attorney general under former Attorney General Robert Morgan and Attorney General Rufus Edmisten.

Active in Democratic party, N.C. Bar, church and civic activities, he managed Sen. Robert Morgan's 1980 re-election campaign and was active in former House Speaker Carl Stewart's campaign for the Democratic nomination for lieutenant governor.

A member of the American Bar Association, N.C. State Bar, the N.C. Bar Association, the North Carolina Academy of Trial Lawyers, the Wake County Academy of Criminal Defense Attorneys, and the Wake County Bar Association, Eagles has been an adjunct professor at the Campbell University School of Law and a lecturer at numerous legal seminars sponsored by the bar association and trial lawyers groups. He has served as an adjunct faculty member in Criminal Justice at Duke University's Institute of Policy Science.

While serving on the attorney general's staff, from 1967 - 1971, Eagles was revisor of statutes and secretary to the North Carolina General Statutes Commission. Later he served as head of the Attorney General's Legislative Drafting Service (1970-74) and thereafter (1974-76) lead the Special Prosecution's Division which tried especially complex criminal cases and otherwise assisted prosecutors across North Carolina.

In addition, Eagles has been an active member and participant in the work of the North Carolina Criminal Code Commission since its creation in 1969. The Commission, appointed by North Carolina's Attorney General, is a criminal law reform group which has prepared revisions of criminal procedure law adopted in 1975 and in 1977 by the North Carolina General Assembly.

While on the attorney general's staff, he argued cases regularly before the N.C. Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court. He has argued for the State in the 4th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals in Richmond and in the Supreme Court of the United States.

Born in Asheville, Eagles, 42, was reared and educated in Saratoga Township in Wilson County. He attended the public schools of Wilson County and Gordon Military College in Barnesville, Ga.

A graduate of Wake Forest University in 1961 and the Wake Forest University School of Law in 1964, Eagles then served for three years active duty as a judge advocate in the U.S. Air Force in Goose Bay, Labrador, and Wash-

ington, D.C. He currently serves in the U.S. Air Force Reserve as a Lt. colonel assigned to the Office of the Administrative Assistant to the Secretary of the Air Force.

Eagles has served as a member of the N.C. State Bar's Legislative Committee, the N.C. Bar Association's Committee on Administration of Justice, the Committee on Advanced Trial Techniques, the Committee on Appellate Rules and the Committee on Criminal Law and Procedure. He now serves as Treasurer of the Criminal Law Section of the N.C. Bar Association.

He has been since 1969 one of North Carolina's members of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws. He is now vice chairman of the national legislative committee of the uniform laws conference and has been a member of several drafting committees including the committee on the Uniform Extradition and Rendition Act, the Committee on Review committee acts and the Review committee on the Uniform Rules of Criminal procedure.

In 1975, he was selected a member of the American Law Institute.

Eagles has been active in the work of his church, serving as deacon, elder and in 1980 and 1981 as chairman of the Official Board of Hillyer Memorial Christian Church. He is a former member and officer of the Raleigh Jaycees and is now a member and committee chairman of the Kiwanis Club of Raleigh. He has been a member of the Board of Wake County Women's Aid, the Board of the Wake County Chapter of the N.C. Symphony Society, and the Board of the Wake County Democratic Men.

He has served the Democratic Party as a precinct chairman and vice chairman and as a member of the Senatorial District Nominating committee for the Wake - Harnett - Lee County Senatorial District.

He lives with his wife, Rachel Phillips Eagles, and their two daughters, Virginia, 12, and Margaret, 8, at 5005 Glen Forest Drive in Raleigh.

Eagles stated that he would work to establish a campaign organization in each of the state's judicial districts.

He said, "I believe that service on the second highest court of our state would be a high honor and a great opportunity for public service. My experience is varied. I have been an advocate in the appellate courts including the Supreme Court of the United States. I have served as a special prosecutor and as a defense lawyer in the trial courts of our state."

"Additionally I have been a draftsman and advocate before the General Assembly and its legislative committees."

Cummings is a native of Pembroke and is commuting until arrangements for suitable housing can be arranged.

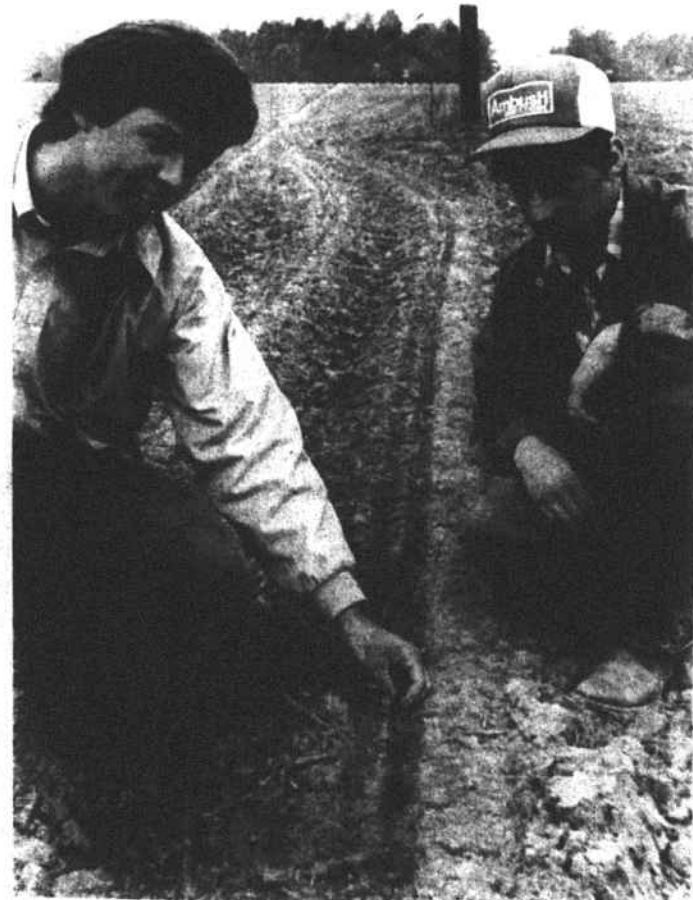
He is single and enjoys all outdoor sports and reading.
