Sanderson Files For N.C. House

Verna "Louise" Sanderson, a Democrat, filed for a seat in the N.C. House of Representatives from District 16 at 11:30 a.m. Friday, May 7.

Miss Sanderson said: "Recently people representing us in state government have stated their intention of withdrawing due to the amount of time involved. It is important that we keep the high standards of representation of the people that we have had in the past and maintain good representation for all people. I have the time and feel I am qualified through education and experience to represent our district and pledge to do this to

the best of my ability if elected." Miss Sanderson is a native of Robeson County, and her parents were Solomon ("Sol") D. and Vernie Nobles Sanderson, life-long merchant of Lumberton and farmer.

On June 30, 1981, Louise retired after approximately 26 years as a probation/parole officer for North Carolina. In 1978 she was chosen Probation/Parole Officer of the Year and represented the Department of Correction at the American Correctional Association Convention.

She is a graduate of Lumberton High School and holds a bachelors'

degree from Meredith College. She taught in public schools in Lumberton for one year and for three years in Bladenboro.

Miss Sanderson also attended Raleigh School of Commerce and worked in the bookkeeping department of Merchant Supply Company. She worked on the tobacco market and maintains an interest in farming.

While employed with Reynolds & Co., she became a registered representative of the N.Y. Stock Exchange.

Miss Sanderson is a member of the First Baptist Church, has held local and state offices in Eastern Star, and is a lifetime member of Beta Sigma Phi.

She also is a member of the Robeson County Democratic Women's Association.
