Horsley Wins

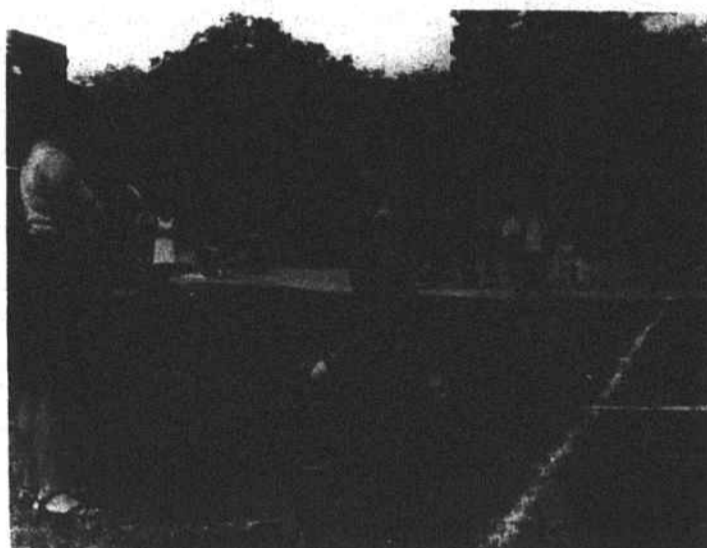
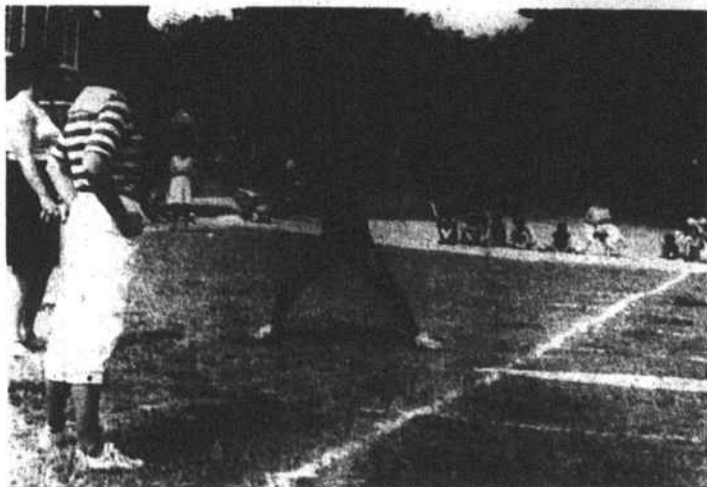
Icesonnia Horsley remains undefeated in her individual events in the TAC Area Meets.

Swimming Lessons

Hoke County Parks and Recreation Commission will be offering the first, advanced beginner, and intermediate swimming lessons for all interested Hoke County residents.

The lessons will be held at 1000 Fulton St. at Mrs. Milo's pool. The lessons will begin on Monday, June 14, and will continue through Friday, June 25. The second session will begin Monday, July 12, and will continue through Friday, July 23.

Classes for both sessions will be offered as follows: 10-10:45 a.m. Beginner; 10:45-11:30 a.m. Intermediate; 11:30-12:15 p.m. Advanced Beginner; 12:15-1 p.m. Beginner; 1-1:45 Beginner.

All classes will have only five students each. For children ages 8-13 the fee will be \$10 for adults ages 19-up the fee will be \$18. This fee includes the cost of mandatory insurance, instruction and pool access.
