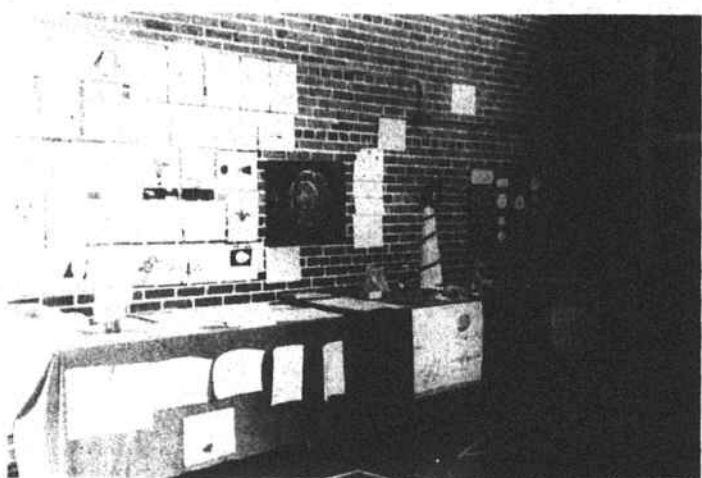

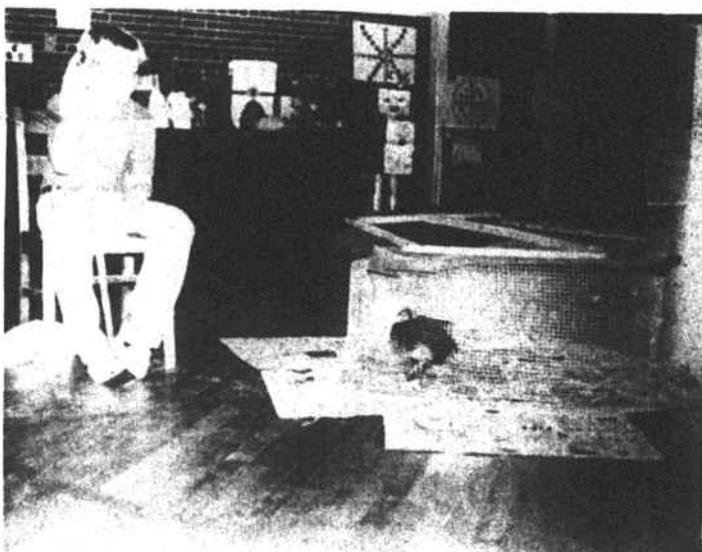
Science Fair At Turlington
