The split Bishop sleeve had an undersleeve of chantilly and a top sleeve of organza appliqued with Rachele. Her chapel train was edged in Rachele and the Peplum of Chantilly trimmed in Rachele. The designer gown was completed by a fingertip veil of illusion with Rachele lace trim.

Rays of sun through the trees added a warm touch to the setting of beautiful flowers adorning the wedding march and lining the aisle as guests gathered for the occasion. 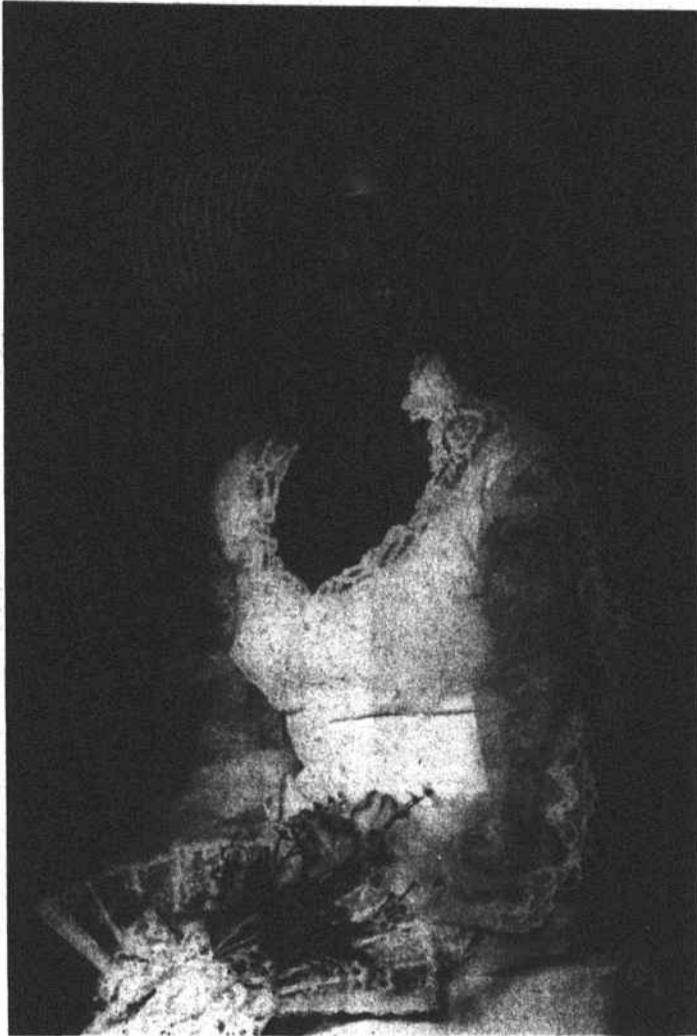

Following the jump, a reception was held in the airport restaurant. The table was adorned with lavender bells and candles. Center attraction was a white spiral cake, separated by Grecian columns and topped with an unusual combination of bride and groom and a second section of white doves, both contained in a gazebo effect. Flowing from the second section of the cake were two gothic bridges each leading to another part of the cake. Figures representing the wedding party were placed on the bridges. The punch was lavender pineapple sherbet, and homemade nuts and lavender mints complemented the chicken salad sandwiches and sausage balls. Completing the table were slices of watermelon and a beautifully prepared melon basket containing a variety of fruits.
