### Swimming Lessons

Hoke County Parks and Recreation Commission will be offering beginner, advanced beginner, and intermediate swimming lessons for all interested Hoke County residents.

The lessons will be taught at 1004 Fulton St. at Mrs. Bill Postel's pool. The instructor will be Mrs. Betty Collins. The first two-week session began Monday and will continue through Friday, June 25.

The second two-week session will begin Monday, July 12, and will continue through Friday, July 23.

Classes for both sessions will be offered as follows: 10:00-10:45 a.m. Adult Beginners; 10:45-11:30 a.m. Intermediate; 11:30-12:15 p.m. Advanced Beginners; 12:15-1 p.m. Beginners; 1-1:45 p.m. Beginners. All classes will have only five students each. For children ages 6-18 the fee is \$13 for adults ages 19-up the fee is \$18. The fee includes the cost of mandatory insurance, instruction and chemical expenses.

If you registered for Session 1, remember June 14 is your first day. Contact the Parks and Recreation office if you missed the registration day and are interested in a class.
