

Leap Tops Her Olympics Mark

Kathy Second In Lite Games

Kathy McMillan Ray of Raeford, silver medalist in the 1976 Olympics, finished second by a half inch Saturday in the women's long jump in the Lite Summer Games at Wallace Wade Stadium at Duke University.

But her jump was her best in two years -- 21 feet 11 inches, which was 1/4th inch better than her medal winning jump in the Montreal Olympics.

A reporter quoted her as saying,

"I've been competing at an average level recently, not at the world-class level like today, and I was studying in there."

She finished behind Carol Lewis, a University of Houston (Tex.) sophomore.

Mrs. Ray, now 24, made her best jump in 1976, though not in the Olympics -- 22 feet 3 inches in the Olympics trials a month before the international games.

Mrs. Ray, now living in Inglewood, Calif., with her husband and

working parttime besides training, will compete on the U.S. team in the international track and field meet at Indianapolis, Ind., scheduled for Friday and Saturday.

July 9-10, she'll work with the Olympic Spirit Program for young

athletes.

Mrs. Ray is aiming to compete in the 1984 Olympics at Los Angeles, Calif.

This fall term she'll return to Tennessee State University to complete her requirements for a degree in physical education.

Blazers Lose To Bragg, Down Red Springs

The Hoke Co. Blazers go down to the wire this weekend holding on to first place in the Tri-County Semi-Pro Baseball League, leading by a game and a half over Ft. Bragg and showing a 16 wins, 6 losses record for the season.

In play this weekend, the Blazers lost on Saturday to Ft. Bragg, 9 to 6, then soundly defeated Red Springs, 19-0, in a game called after five innings due to rain Sunday afternoon.

Unbeaten by Ft. Bragg in three previous games, except in pre-season play, the Blazers were without their hitting punch in the Saturday defeat. While the Bragg Dragons piled up 14 hits and we made 2 miscues, our boys could only get 8 hits against errorless ball by the Army men. Decidedly, this was the best game played between these two teams in their four matches this season and, it appeared, the Blazers were in the game even in the late innings. Mark Madden contributed a triple, Mike Nieves went 3 for 4 on singles, and Bruce Hurst was 2 for 4 with 2 RBI's for the day. Carpenter and Rachmaan pitched, with Carpenter taking the loss.

Against the Red Springs Orioles the Blazers regained their hitting strength. While the Orioles made too many mistakes and their three pitchers all had control problems, the Blazer Bats were definitely

smoking with 11 big hits.

Mike Nieves had a homer and Cecil Blake a double to lead their mates and give Red Springs, now in third place, its first shut-out of the year. Kenny Carpenter was 2 for 3 and Stan Cummings a big 3 for 4 -- both with consistent hitting. Raschad Rachmaan posted the pitching victory.

This Saturday it's St. Pauls for the Blazers' away game and on Sunday, July 4, at 3 p.m. it's a home game against Lumber Bridge at the Hoke High field in the last game of the regular season.

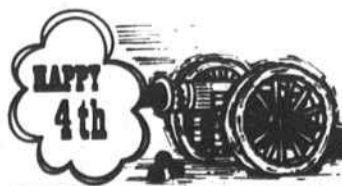
