Physicals July 31 For 1982-83 Sports



Burlington Sales Lower

Burlington Industries, Inc. today reported lower sales and earnings for both its third fiscal quarter and the first nine months of the 1982 fiscal year.

Consolidated net sales for the quarter ended July 3, 1982 were \$719,395,000 on which the company's consolidated net earnings vere \$12,834,000 or 45 cents per share. In the comparable period last year, Burlington reported net sales of \$858,426,000 on which the company's net earnings were \$35, 078,000 or \$1.25 per share.

For the nine months ended July 3, 1982 consolidated net sales were \$2,199,233,000 compared to \$2, 386,345,000 in the prior year. Net earnings were \$44,480,000 or \$1.57 per share compared to \$80,140,000 or \$2.85 per share last year.

As a result of adopting FASB

Statement No. 52 in the first quarter of 1982, the effect of foreign currency items is not comparable with those reported in 1981 as prior year results were not restated. Foreign currency items included in the earnings statement for the third quarter of fiscal 1982 were not material. The fiscal 1981 results included gains from foreign currency items of 26 cents per share in the third quarter and 68 cents per share for the nine months. Klopman, chairman and chief

executive officer, commented,

"The third quarter results reflect a continuation of the economic weakness which has persisted in this fiscal year. There was virtually no segment of our business which was order rates would indicate there will be no significant upturn prior to the end of fiscal 1982."
