All participants will be given medals as well as free admission into the Oktoberfest Internationale which is scheduled for the same day.

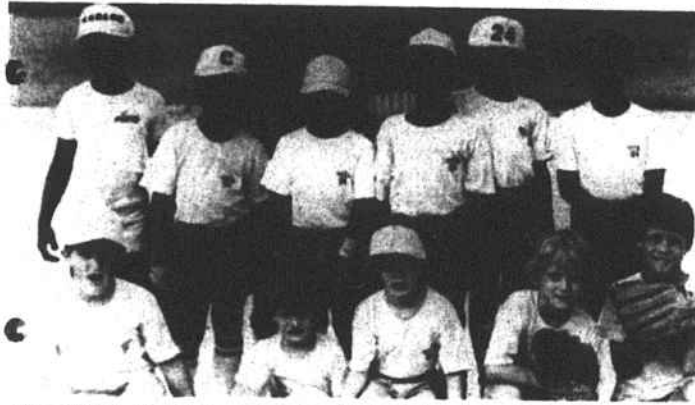
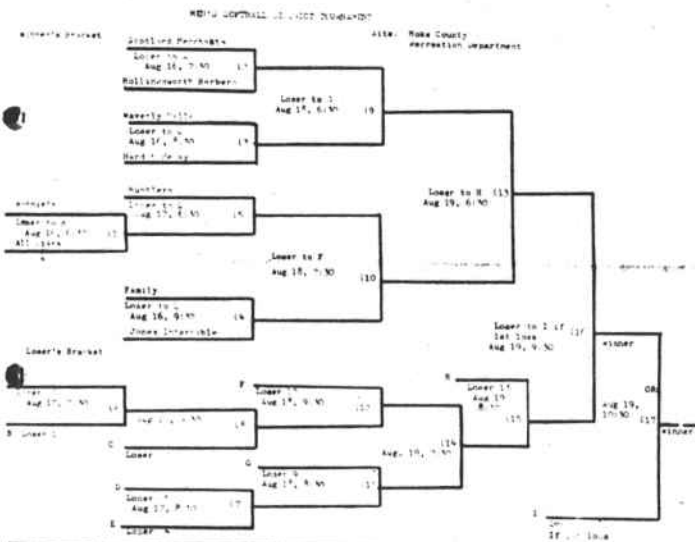
