DUI, Red Light, Sign Violations Heard

The following District Court judgments were issued Thursday. Monroe Roscoe, Jr., Fayetteville,

following too closely, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor.

Dorothy James Hayes, Raeford, failing to stop for a red light, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

John Mark McNair, Rt. 1, Wagram, speeding 55 in a 45 zone, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; driving under the influence, 90 days suspended for 12 months, \$150 and costs, surrender license and not drive for 12 months, limited-driving privilege granted, and complete successfully within 75 days the Drug and Alcohol Abuse School.

let, speeding 65 in a 55 zone, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Larry Devone Bronson, Rt. 14, Fayetteville, failing to stop for a police light and siren, speeding more than 15 miles per hour above the speed limit and in excess of 55 in an attempt to elude arrest, driving under the influence, failing to drive on the right, failing to stop at a stop sign, and speeding 75 in a 55 zone, six to 12 months suspended for two years, \$250 and costs, surrender license and not drive for 12 months.

A resolution was proposed and a certificate of appreciation prepared for Mrs. M.M. (Clara) Belle who had served faithfully for the past four years, representing Moore County.

Director's Report

Director Bill Bridgman referred to his quarterly activity report. The Montgomery County Public Library became a department of county government on July 1, he said. All libraries in the SRL System are now departments of county government except libraries in Richmond County.

Mrs. John B. Smith, Mrs. Beulah McPherson and Jake Killian gave short reports on the NC Trustee/Librarian Conference they had attended in Chapel Hill, June 1-2.

Business Manager/Finance Officer Betsy Cadieu presented an analysis of financial affairs of the system for the past year and a

revised budget for fiscal year 82-83.

Following a thorough discussion, a motion to accept the budget of \$355,760 as recommended was made by Carey Nicholson, seconded by Mrs. Richardson, and adopted.

Also, the board accepted an LSCA grant of \$18,770 for 82-83. The funds will be used to purchase books, audiovisual materials and equipment to strengthen resources of member libraries so they can continue to reach all segments of the communities.

20th ANNIVERSARY PLANS

In other action at the board meeting, an official stamp approval was given to plans for the regional 20th Anniversary Celebration. The Sandhill Regional Library System was formed in September 1962, and the event will be commemorated with various events throughout the year.
