Drunk Driving, Assault, Drug Charges Are Heard

The following judgments were issued Thursday in Hoke County District Court.

Roger Alen Oldham, Rt. 1, Box 206A, Shannon, failing to stop at the scene of an accident, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; driving left of center, six months suspended for two years, \$200 and costs.

Robert Taylor, Rt. 1, Box 637A, Red Springs, driving under the influence, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; charged with the same offense on long warrant and pled guilty -- 90 days suspended for 12 months, \$150 and costs, surrender license and not drive for 12 months, limited - driving privilege granted, and complete successfully within 75 days the Drug and Alcohol Abuse School.

Sidney Townsend, Rt. 1, Box 179-E, Red Springs, assault by pointing a gun, found not guilty.

Anthony Christopher Davis, Rt. 4, Box 515., Raeford, possession of marijuana, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; possession of drug

paraphernalia (needle, pipe, and rolling papers), driving under the influence, and speeding 100 in a 55 zone, pleaded guilty to possession of drug paraphernalia, DUI, and speeding, six to 12 months suspended for three years, \$500 and costs, surrender license and not drive for 12 months; driving in excess of 55 and at least .5 over the legal limit, and careless and reckless driving, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor.

Harold Herron Morrison, Jr., Fayetteville, speeding 47 in a 35 zone, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Marion L. Dobson, Rt. 1, Greer, S.C., possession of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia (rolling papers, a scale, and plastic bags), and transporting an alcoholic beverages container with seal broken, six to 12 months suspended for three years, \$300 and costs; driving under the influence of a drug, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor.

Louise Monroe McMillan, Rt. 4, Raeford, speeding 48 in a 35 zone, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Michael Wayne Chavis, Laurel Hill, failing to drive on the right, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; driving under the influence,

90 days suspended for 12 months, \$150 and costs, surrender license and not drive for 12 months, limited - driving privilege granted, and complete successfully within 75 days the Drug and Alcohol Abuse School.

Robert Lee Fisher, Jr., Rt. 1, Box 500, Raeford, leaving beer bottles temporarily on a road right-of-way, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Friday's judgments follow.

James M. Carpenter, 518 E. Fifth Ave., Raeford, worthless check, six to 12 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$50 and costs, and \$124.70 restitution to Webb's Tire Service.

Alexander McArn, Rt. 1, Box 321C, Shannon, worthless check, prayer for judgment continued, costs; restitution made prior to the entry of the plea of guilty.

Horace McFadyen, Rt. 1, Shannon, intoxicated and disruptive, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor, in the interests of justice, due to the defendant's limited mental capacity.

Ray Costin, Harmony Heights MHP, Raeford, communicating threats, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; prosecuting witness didn't appear to testify.

Jim Southerland, Harmony Heights Trailer Park, Raeford, communicating threats, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; defendant has agreed to plead guilty to a charge of injury to property; injury to personal property, six to 12 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$450 restitution to Earlene Carver, Harmony Heights Trailer Park, and costs, and not go on the premises of or harass the prosecuting witness for two years.

Roberta L. Beasley, Rt. 2, Box 201A, Raeford, five worthless checks, 30 days each count, suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$14.28, \$19.35, \$10 and \$10 restitution to Hardin's Food Store, and \$11.21 restitution to Cole's Food Store, and costs.

Ronald Clarence Morrissey, Rt. 3, Box 252B, Raeford, breaking and entering, and assault with a deadly weapon, 12 months to two years.

Jessie James Locklear, Rt. 3, Box 281, Red Springs, failing to stop at the scene of an accident, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; out-of-court settlement made, damages to vehicle paid for.

Gloria Glover, Pine Forest MHP, Raeford, worthless check, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; check paid off.

Johnny Rogers, Rt. 4, Box 282A, Red Springs, two counts, overtime parking, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; defendant on jury duty at the time he got the ticket.

Calvin Beatty, Lamont Street, Raeford, nonsupport, pleaded no contest, 30 days suspended for five years, pay \$40 weekly for support of children, and costs; costs remitted.

Charles Leroy Doak, Sr., Rt. 1, Box 646, Red Springs, five worthless checks, 30 days, suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$13 and \$24.60 restitution to Averitt's Grocery Store; 90 days to six months, suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$105.82 restitution to Macks, 30 days suspended for two years, \$27.71 restitution to Macks and costs; and 30 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$4.77 restitution to Macks, and costs.

Linda Faye Allen, Apt. 2A, Hotel Apartments, Raeford, disposal of mortgaged property, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor; property returned to Heilig-Meyers.

Brad Kane, Harmony Heights, MHP, Raeford, injury to personal property, pleaded not guilty, found guilty, six to 12 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$450 restitution to Earlene Carver, and costs, and not go on the premises of or harass the prosecuting witness for two years.

Kathleen Talbot, 515 E. Fifth Ave., Raeford, two counts of larceny by trick, pleaded not guilty, found guilty, six to 12 months suspended for three years, \$150 and costs, and \$45 restitution each to Ethel Lee Melvin and Helen Jackson.

Ronald Clarence Morrissey, Rt. 3, Raeford, probation provided June 4 for misdemeanor possession of stolen goods is revoked because of violations of conditions of probation, to pay total \$732 (defendant has fallen in arrears) and committed criminal offenses (pleaded guilty August 27 to assault with a deadly weapon, and breaking and entering); the defendant to serve six to 12 months to begin at the expiration of the June 4 sentence of six to 12 months, the defendant sentenced to 12 months to two years on the guilty pleas of August 27, with work-release recommended, and credited with 23 days spent in confinement prior to the date of judgment, to run concurrently with the other sentences.

Wilbert Lee Jones, McCain, assault, pleaded not guilty, found guilty, 90 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, secure appointment with Sandhills Center or a psychiatrist of his own choosing, follow guidance of psychologist in regard to treatment, this condition to apply if wife also agrees to mental health treatment; and pay costs, costs remitted.

Shane Fitch, 128 Utah St., Harmony Heights, Raeford, assault with a deadly weapon, found not guilty.

Charles Price, 412 S. Magnolia St., Raeford, larceny of an automobile, two years, but to serve six months with the remainder of the sentence suspended and the defendant placed on probation for two years on conditions the defendant follow direction of the probation officer with respect to mental-health treatment and counseling, attend counseling on drug abuse if the probation officer so directs, continue to take his prescribed medication, contact, with the probation officer's assistance, the Southeastern Vocational Rehabilitation Center, and cooperate with the assigned social worker; the defendant be credited, against the suspended portion of the term, with 97 days spent in jail before trial.

Patterson, Rt. 3, Box 70, Raeford, obtaining property for worthless check, six to 12 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$30 restitution to Macks Stores, and costs; worthless check, 30 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$40 and \$30 restitution to Morrison's Grocery and Texaco, and costs; worthless check, 30 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$40 restitution to Jimmy's, and costs; obtaining property with worthless check, six to 12 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$25 restitution to McMillan Food Mart, and costs; worthless check, 30 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$30 restitution to Macks, and costs.

Freddie Harris, Rt. 3, Raeford, assault with a deadly weapon, found not guilty.

Ray Costin, Harmony Heights MHP, Raeford, injury to personal property, pleaded not guilty, found guilty, six to 12 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$450 restitution to Earlene Carver, and costs, and not go on the premises of or harass the prosecuting witness for two years.

Henry Lee LeGrand, Box 731,

Raeford, shoplifting, 90 days suspended for three years, \$100 and costs, and not go on the premises of Leo's Wig Fair for three years.

Nathaniel Legrand, Box 731, Raeford, simple affray, and injury to real property, 90 days suspended, \$98 restitution to Julian Wright, and costs.

John Adams Wilson, Rt. 3, Raeford, assault on a female, pleaded guilty to assault, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

Kesley R. Hickman, Jr., Box 27, Parkton, worthless check, 90 days suspended for two years, \$256.85 restitution to Arabia Auto Sales, and costs.

William Neal Patterson, 513 E. Fifth Ave., Raeford, assault, found not guilty.

Alton McCoy, Rt. 1, Box 144, Raeford, assault on a female, found not guilty, prosecuting witness to pay costs for frivolous and

malicious prosecution.

Donnie Henderson, Rt. 2, Raeford, overtime parking, defendant on jury duty at the time of overparking.

Roberta Beasley, Rt. 2, Box 201A, Raeford, worthless check, 30 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$15 restitution to Hardin's Food Store, and costs.

Don Woods, Rt. 1, Box 716, Shannon, burning personal property, and assault, pleaded not guilty, found guilty, six to 18 months suspended for two years, probation for two years, \$1,000 restitution to Isabel Woods, and costs.

Cecil Jerry West, Rt. 1, Box 629, Raeford, larceny, two counts of uttering forged checks, three counts of forgery, and one count of uttering a forged paper, waived probably-cause hearing.
