

Books Close Voter Signup On Monday

The books will close for voter registration on Monday. Persons wishing to cast ballots in the upcoming November 2 general election should register before 5 p.m. Monday.

Voters will also be able to cast "One-Stop" absentee ballots beginning Tuesday if they plan to be out of the county on November 2.

The One-Stop polls will be open from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at the Board of Elections office on Elwood Street.
