The program will include Persichetti's Symphony for Band, Opus 69; Chorale Prelude: "Turn Not Thy Face," Opus 105; "Bagatelles for Band," Opus 87 and "Celebrations," Opus 103, a setting of Walt Whitman poems.

The Ensemble Choir concert is one of the concluding events of East Carolina's 75th Anniversary Homecoming Week and was originally planned as the culmination of a three-day visit by composer Persichetti to ECU, during which he was to present a lecture-demonstration and conduct a faculty concert.

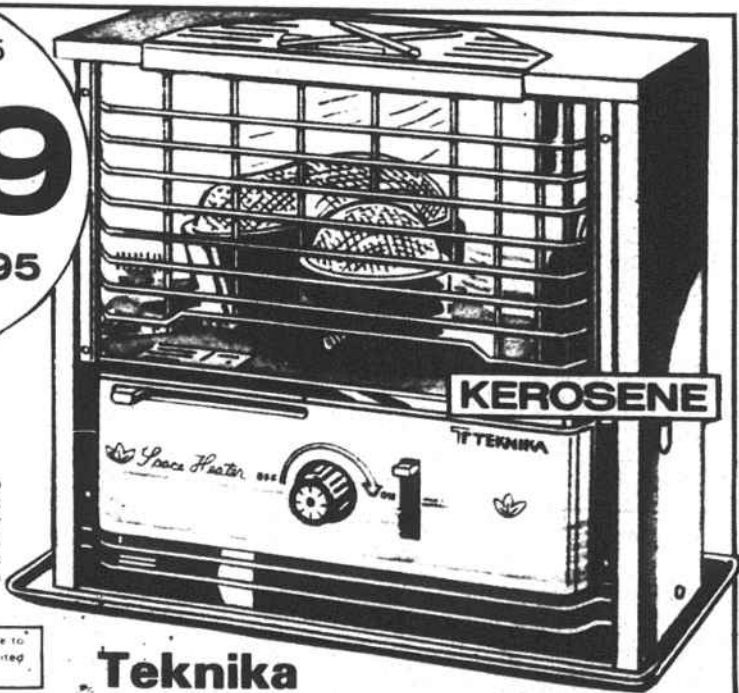

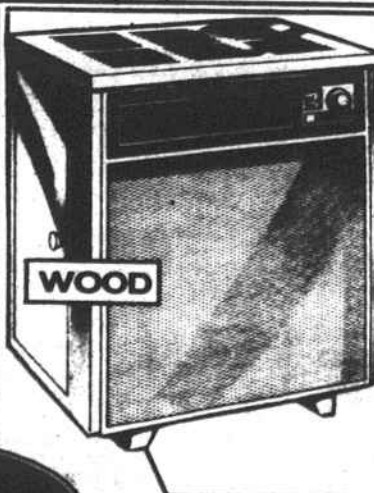
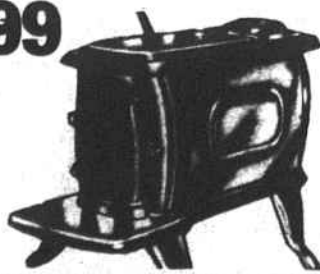
