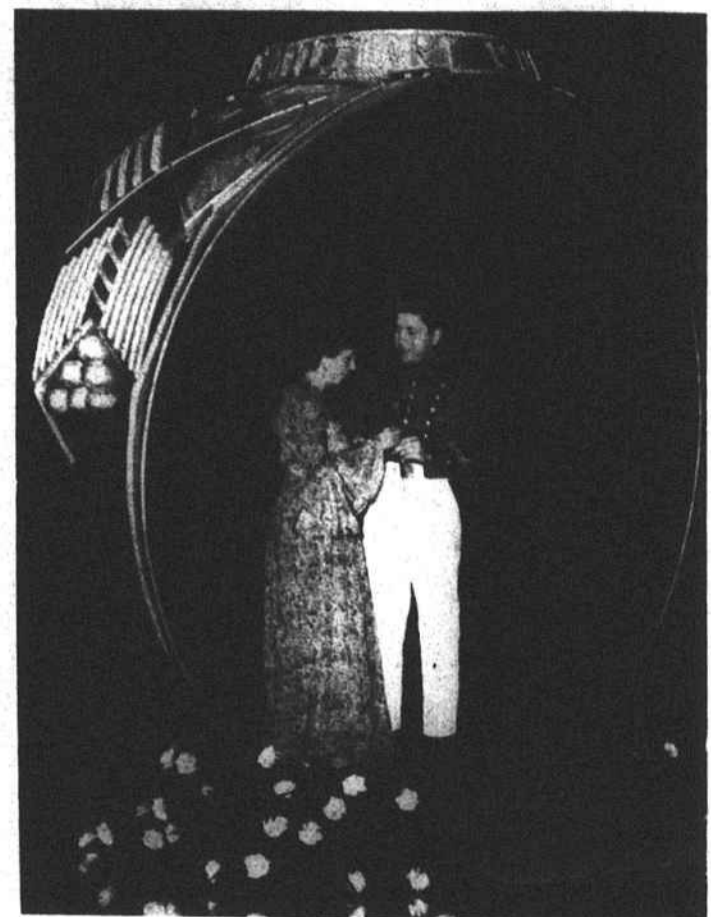
They spent the day touring the campus, meeting faculty members, and being entertained by a wide variety of spectator and participant activities.

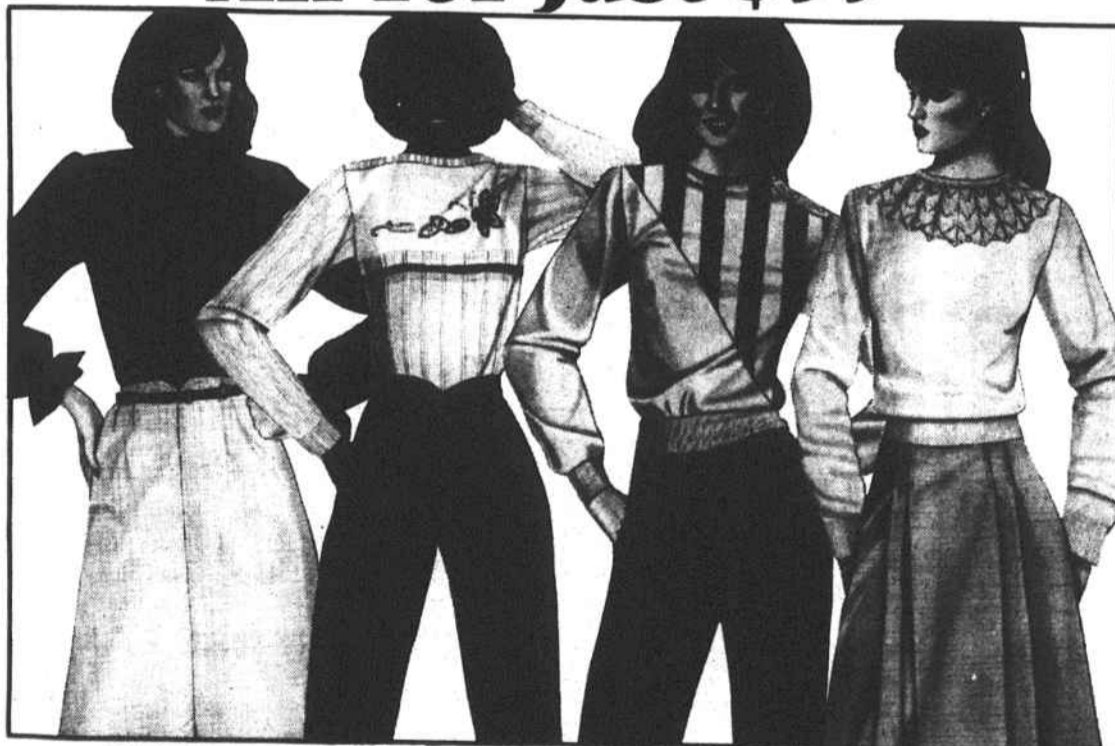
